The Baptism of the Lord

January 12, 2020

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

Whenever a child is baptized, it is a joyous event for the whole family. As Catholics, we believe that baptism a gift from God who invites even the very youngest, smallest members of our human family to grow in Christian faith through the example, witness, and love of their parents. Baptism is not a reward for passing a catechism class; it is not simply a celebration marking the birth of a new child; it is not a magic ceremony to provide 'soul insurance' against untimely death or other misfortune. Baptism is act of faith on part of the parents and on part of the Church, where God's life and grace offered to new members of the Church.

Baptism completes the Christmas mysteries. Through the Incarnation, Christ stands among his people, uniting them in the message of divine hope. In his Epiphany, Jesus reveals the Trinitarian God of Father, Son, and Spirit, calling all people through signs and wonders to common faith and common worship. Both of these celebrations are funda-



mentally *observational* in nature. Do we see? Are we watching? In Baptism, Jesus offers something more: He offers humanity a visible means of *participation* in the Body of Christ. God takes the initiative to reach across the chasm between heaven and earth, between God's glory and humanity's fallen condition in sin, to freely offer *sanctifying grace* to those who desire it. Sanctifying grace is the gift of God's life dwelling within the human heart, preparing the soul to receive the grace of God's kingdom, in union with all who share this faith as brothers and sisters.

The celebration of Christmas has, up to now, memorialized the invitation Jesus makes to "come and see". You see Christ in the manger and he receives the adoration of shepherds. The star appears marking his birth and you see the kings of the many nations come to pay homage. Jesus matures in age and wisdom within his family and we see his holy mother being drawn into deep contemplation of the things she has witnessed. In the coming weeks we will recall how he calls his first disciples and initiates his mission to proclaim "a year of favor from the Lord." Indeed, Jesus is worthy of all adoration, homage, and contemplation, and must have been



a compelling figure to draw so many people to himself. Have these stories formed our hearts to inspire a worthy response in us? Do we hear the call to faith from all these signs and wonders? Are we ready to follow him into a baptism of repentance and new life? Do we want for ourselves and our children what the child in the manger offers? For those of us who have been baptized, perhaps many years ago, do we hear the call to be renewed in the baptismal promises to avoid sin and live for God alone?

Christmas is not a place we "go" each year in order to encounter Baby Jesus, only to "leave" when the celebration is over. For Christmas to make an ongoing spiritual impact, we must "take" or "receive" from the encounter and carry it into our daily lives, dwelling with Christ who is now among us. Jesus came at Christmas to free us from our sins. Did we "take" or "receive" that gift this season? Can we point to a place in our lives where the divine love of Christ has freed us, *today*, from the God-forsakenness that still ravages the world? Jesus came at Christmas time to help us know the Father. Do we now really *know* better the Father who so loved the world that he sent his only son? Does this make a difference in our post-Christmas lives? Jesus came at Christmastime to make our families holy like his own Holy Family. Can we point to God's grace embracing and renewing our own families and marriages?

This Christmas, we have taken the time to slow down, to peer into the stable scene, and to offer homage and adoration. Do we realize that in this act of worship, we are the ones to receive the precious gift of his presence?


A Message from Mrs. Carol Frericks—Principal




