

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

On Vacation! I will be on vacation starting immediately after Masses this weekend, through February 1. The parish office will be on normal hours. Except for communion services on Thursday and Friday, the Mass schedule should continue as usual. The 'emergency line' is available through the parish office to assist in finding help in the event of a medical emergency requiring the sacramental ministry of a Catholic priest.

A reminder during this cold and flu season: Please use prudence and good judgment with respect to cold and flu season. Stay home if you are sick! Please refrain receiving from the common cup if you are sick or if your immune system is compromised due to immune-suppressants, chemotherapy, etc. While it is a pious thought that Holy Communion might be protected against disease transmission due to its sublime holiness, the elements do participate, according to God's plan and providence, in the physical reality of the ordinary world and, thus, can become a disease vector.

Those unable to go to Mass due to weather, health, or any other reason are encouraged to spend time in prayer at home. We are blessed to have a televised Mass here in Quincy, thanks to the Knights of Columbus, who sponsor and produce the broadcast each Sunday on KHQA-ABC (over-air channel 7.2 or Comcast channel 3,) at 10:30am. This is a worthy and pious way to join the Church in prayer and to stir the desire for the intimate Spiritual Communion experienced at Mass. Television-Mass does not substitute for actual Mass attendance to fulfil the Sunday obligation. Rather, when God does not pro-



vide the means to attend Mass as usual due to legitimate health or safety concerns, the obligation is simply considered 'lifted'. A good standard to use to decide whether one is under the obligation to attend Mass or not is to ask oneself if, given the same conditions, one might go to the grocery store, a sports practice. or another social event outside the home?

<u>Parish Annual Financial Statement and individual contribution statements</u> are available this week. Please take them at the doors of the church so we do not have to mail them to you! Thank you to all who so generously support the mission and the ministry of St. Anthony Church and St. Dominic School.

Despite best efforts, we did run a deficit for the 2019-2020 fiscal year. While we have not recognized our ongoing deficits accumulating over the years formally as 'debt', we have floated about \$200,000 in liabilities out of each fiscal year into the next year on the strength of our cash flow. By this I mean that, while we are supposed to pay ACSA and pensions accrued in the prior fiscal period (pre June 30 of each year, amounting to about \$100,000), we have been typically carrying them into the next year for payment. We also typically have been using about \$100,000 of cash collected for the "next year's" tuition (for the year after July 1 each year) to pay old year's (pre-June 30th) liabilities. We are now coming to a point with our savings depleted, that there is simply



not enough cash to 'float' us on these deficits, and I will likely have to formally recognize a debt (probably in the form of being unable to pay last year's or this year's ACSA residuals by June 30 of 2020) with the diocese, which causes a lot of other problems for us as a parish. Again, I ask all parishioners to please be generous with this year's Annual Catholic Services Appeal (ACSA) assessment... supporting this assessment very definitely and directly supports your parish.

We have been doing better in recent weeks at meeting our \$13,000 'goal' listed on page 4. Thank you to all who have stepped up since my talk in November! Last week, of course, our attendance was down significantly due to the weather, and so our collections were down as well. This 'goal' is pretty much an absolute 'must' to be able to maintain services at current levels and to keep from going any further into deficit and debt spending.

It is better for me to make sure that everyone knows our situation, as pressing as it is, rather than to hold back on 'bad' or maybe merely 'challenging' news. But this is a challenge-point for us all recommit to supporting our outstanding parish and school. Thank you to all who support St. Anthony Church and St. Dominic School so generously!


