

I'm on vacation this week, to return on Friday. One of the questions that comes into the office during January is about our diocesan newspaper, the *Catholic Times*.

In your envelope pack this month, you received an envelope for the *Catholic Times* with a suggested donation of \$15. While the diocese and the *Catholic Times* have asked parishes to take up a collection during January for years—decades, actually—there is always a bit of confusion when people ask questions about what it means to donate to this cause and what it means to be 'subscribed' to the *Catholic Times...* questions which by all rights is their privilege to ask, and I'll do my best to answer.

The *Catholic Times* is the newspaper of the Diocese of Springfield, and by mandate of bishops going back certainly to Bishop O'Connor, if not before, all house-

holds in the diocese are to receive the publication. Parishes are billed not for the number of households receiving the publication, but rather they are billed by a percentage of their regular income. Assessing parishes this way encourages parishes to see the delivery of the *Catholic Times* as a means of evangelization. Indeed under this method, pastors are not incentivized to 'trim' their parishioner lists as tightly as possible in order to minimize the number of households receiving the *Catholic Times*. Instead, those who may not go to Mass regularly, whether they be 'fallen away' or in a nursing home or another institution are more likely to be included in the parish lists, so that they may receive bi-weekly news and spiritual readings, and maintain a connection with the Church. I remember a few years ago as I was serving on a board in Springfield that, when the expense and trouble of publishing a paper, such as the *Catholic Times*, came up, it Bishop Lucas' response that "if the expense and effort of having the *Catholic Times* show up in someone's mailbox every week for 20 years, and just once they are lead to open it up and return to Church and in doing so save their soul, then it is well worth it." I would agree with that, and it is in that same spirit, under evangelization, discipleship, and stewardship that we publish our own monthly newsletter.

And so, we have the *Catholic Times* as an evangelization tool, not unlike this bulletin and our monthly parish newsletter. They serve the function of being passed around and delivering news and spiritual articles, not only to those faithfully in Church every week, but also to those who are responsibility to evangelize. In the past, the \$15 suggested donation was called a "subscription", which was probably a mis-nomer. Instead, the suggested donation is a share in the expense which will be assessed to St. Anthony's for our share of making this publication available to our parishioners and across the diocese. In actuality, our assessment will probably be on the order of \$10-12,000. If we were to divide this equally among our 500 families, that 'share' per family would probably be closer to \$25 per family. (This is reminding me that I should probably make that adjustment in our envelope order for next year when it comes around!) In any case, your assistance with this envelope is a well-appreciated donation to assist an assessment against the parish, and will be directed to covering this expense which will be due by the end of the fiscal year.

You may have noticed the new full-color tabloid format of the *Times*. I have been informed that this transition has been done to save expenses, which is commendable on part of the diocese. Indeed, they also had quantitative data demonstrating that the size of the print and the contrast of the page against normal light is improved vs. the old newsprint versions of years gone by. This was intended by design to make the new format easier to read.

How do I 'un-subscribe"? There is not an elegant way to do this, but occasionally there is a good reason to be "un-subscribed". Let the parish office know if you would like to be taken off of the Catholic Times list for any reason. This will not remove you from other lists that the diocese requires us to send, nor will it reduce the expense incurred by the parish for the Catholic Times, but it will clear out your mailbox and save the marginal printing/production cost of sending one more copy out. In recent years there were opportunities to receive the *Times* electronically. I am not sure if this is still available—I was annoyed that they wouldn't send it out as a simple PDF, but rather as a link that required one to use a clumsy Flashbased 'reader'—but if anyone is interested, I would be happy to look into it for you.
