A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Most people associate the required adherence to a strong moral code as an essential part of "religion". Indeed, the word "religion" comes from the same root from which we get the English words *ruler*, meaning a 'standard', and even *ligament* and *ligature* and *ligation* which has the sense of 'connecting', 'constraint' or 'binding'. When asked why parents make the sacrifice to send their kids to Catholic Schools, very frequently I will hear something like, "I want my

children to grow up with the values I was taught." When we think of the world we want our children to inherit and what we need to do to make a better society, often times we simply want it to be more 'nice'. We expect our laws and their enforcement to exemplify 'iustice'. We are concerned as to where the 'lines' are... "...is it a sin if... " ... so that we do not break the letter of the law. Seminarians preparing for priesthood spend a fair amount of their time studying moral and ethical theory so that they can be good confessors and so that they can negotiate moral thinking inferred from the Scripture and Tradition of the Church when it is not explicit. What do we think about the death penalty? ... of war? ... of premarital relations? ... of opportunities available to us by way of medical science? Jesus certainly didn't say anything about stem cell research in the bible, but he did give us principles to live by and the challenge to live not by the letter, but by the spirit of the law. Jesus was himself, an observant Jew, for the most part. He honored and respected the Law which constituted the people of Israel as God's Holy People. But he also challenged the Law when its observance became an end to itself. One might come to learn through Jesus that religion is not what makes people good or righteous, rather it is the participation in the life of God that perfects the moral human

Isaiah speaks to Israel, calling them to a new observance of the Law. Indeed, not simply to the letter of the Law, but the *Mitzvahs* (god deeds done out of religious duty) which spread the charity of the Law to others. In giving bread to the poor and providing shelter for the homeless, we are not only observing the Law for our own salvation, but all the more, we mystically become God's hand of deliverance and mercy which is being shown to the one who receives! By answering the cries for help, we become like the dawn for those who are walking in the valley of darkness, leading those in need to safety. When we restrain our gossip and ill-speech and accusation of others, the gloom of the accuser, who night and day curses us before God, is cast out of our midst!

Indeed, as our psalm proclaims, "the just man is a light in the darkness to the upright!" Religion forms and trains and instructs us in virtue. The choice to live a virtuous live is presented to men and women of each day and age and in every circumstance of life and living. It is that response which is salvific: it is a response to grace.



Lent is just a few weeks away. One of the events we have coming up is our bible study on Wisdom Literature. What is "Wisdom Literature"? Wisdom Literature comes from the Old Testament books of Job, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Song of Songs, Wisdom, and Sirach.... some would also include the Psalms. These books are rather strange and different from many of the other scriptural books, as they are not really narra-

tive in nature, but rather are filled with canticles and sayings and maxims which are passed along with the hope that the reader can become "wise" in the ways of God. The program we will be running was put together by Jeff Cavins and Thomas Smith and is called "Wisdom: God's Vision for Life". All are invited. We will gather on Wednesday nights during Lent after the Wednesday evening Mass. There will be a short video and time to share and discuss the Scriptures. We are planning to provide a simple soup supper for those who are attending, and thus we would appreciate those who plan to join us to let us know so that we prepare enough for everyone. 
