#### A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



St. Paul proclaims, "What eye has not seen, and ear has not heard, and what has not entered the human heart, what God has prepared for those who love him," this God has revealed to us through the Spirit. (1 Cor 2:9) I think when we come to the end of our lives and look upon the immensity of eternity, that we will be surprised at what we will see. Certainly the mysteries of this world will be solved—the losses we have suffered will be returned, the wounds we have sustained will be healed—but what will the Kingdom of God be like? It is hard to say.

One of the images that comes to mind is that of being at a restaurant, or perhaps a store, and receiving an unexpected bonus—maybe a discount that you were not aware of, or a sale that was not advertised. Maybe someone paid your bar tab before going to your table or you received extra good service from the waitstaff in the restaurant. Maybe you had to wait an extra long time because of a lost ticket or slow kitchen or over-done steak and your meal was 'comped'. In all of these situations there was somethings special... something unexpected... because the management was trying to "go the extra mile" or "above and beyond the call of duty" to make the evening special. Might that have something to do with the Kingdom of Heaven?

We worry about justice and equality so much here on earth, and our laws reflect that in so many ways. Those who commit crimes are punished. Those who earn incomes are taxed by a proportional formula. Those who stand in the front of a line go before those at the end. Justice maintains order in our society. Our God is, indeed, "just", but God's justice is more than simple equality and fairness. Listen to his words today: "You shall not kill; and whoever kills will be liable to judgment. But I say to you, whoever is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment." Later, "You have heard that it was said, You shall not commit adultery. But I say to you, everyone who looks at a woman with lust has already committed adultery with her in his heart." Jesus quotes the Law and gives respect for the Law, but then he surprisingly supersedes it... making it more challenging to keep, perhaps, but more importantly, calling his followers to go 'above and beyond' the simple call of duty. That is the culture of heaven. That is the attitude of the saints. That is the grace and mercy of God in action. God intends us to live in that space beyond what the world understands as 'justice' and to live in the 'space of grace' which lies above it. Next week we will hear Jesus criticize the famous law that one should seek an "eye for an eye," reminding us that the "space of grace" lies in 'going the extra mile.' If a person sues you for your tunic or orders you to go with them for a mile? Give them your cloak as well; go with them for the second mile. Won't the centurion be surprised with your reponse? It speaks something of our faith as Christians. To repurpose Paul's words a bit, eye has not seen, nor has ear heard of such accommodation of our neighbor. We barely know from watching earthly justice how overwhelming heavenly grace works! We do not settle for "just enough", but are always looking for ways to perfect our virtue, justice, and generosity.

THANK YOU to all who have responded to the call in recent weeks to help close the gap between our budgeted 'goal' and our shortfall for this year! We have made significant progress on this since about Christmas, and it is making a big difference in helping us stay on top of our current obligations! We still have a long way to go before the end of the fiscal year, and often the last month (June) tends to be pretty lean, but many thanks are in order for getting us close to our budgeted goal again!





Our Lenten "Wisdom Literature" bible study series starts on Ash Wednesday after Mass, and continues each Wednesday after the evening Mass at St. Anthony's. Join us in exploring a part of the bible which can be confusing due to its structure which sometimes lacks a narrative core. "Wisdom Literature"

includes the books of the bible full of sayings and practical maxims intended to guide the reader into an appreciation of God's presence and divine power in a world that seems marked by the reality of injustice and confusion in everyday life. For the Wednesdays after Ash Wednesday, we plan to serve a weekly soup supper in conjunction with the bible study, and so we would appreciate a count at the parish office, (217) 222-5996, of those who plan to attend.
