A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



We have heard in recent weeks that our Lord wants us to fulfil not only the *letter*, but the *spirit* of the Law. We are to be salt and light for the world, living not for ourselves, but for others. This week we are given a teaching on the importance of living in forgiveness. Of all the sins, of all the psychological pathologies, of all the spiritual losses that we can suffer in our lives,

there is perhaps nothing so useful to Satan himself, than a heart which lacks the ability to forgive those who have offended us. St. Thomas Aquinas famously explains that anger comes from the corruption of justice—and we all know from our own lives how easily it is to jump to wrath and anger...and sin...when we have been offended. This week's reading from Leviticus understands that tension so well as it explains that "even though you may have to reprove your fellow citizen, do not let that lead you to sin."

Jesus says, "you have heard it was said, an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth, but I say to you, offer no resistance at all." This famous "eye for an eye" teaching comes from the ancient Babylonian king, Hammurabi, as a major development in civil and criminal law. His code prescribes only limited 'payback' by those have been wronged... no more than comparable losses... an eye for an eye, for example. This prevents members of society from going the next step where revenge grows at each exchange of evil between parties— parties who ironically become less and less aware of the original offense while the violence escalates.

The only thing in this world which can heal sin and injustice is love. As a challenge for the upcoming Lenten season, look to unforgiveness as the greatest sin—and perverted pleasure—to give up in the coming 40 days. When the darkness of unforgiveness flees, how much more room there is for the transformative love of God!

Lenten Regulations: The Season of Lent begins this year on Ash Wednesday, February 26, 2020 and will end just prior to the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 9, 2020, when the Paschal Triduum begins. Lent is the principal penitential season in the Church year. All Christian Faithful are urged to develop and maintain a program of self-denial, prayer, and the performance of deeds of charity and mercy (including giving of alms), in addition to the following minimal Lenten disciplines:

- <u>ABSTINENCE</u> Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
 - While abstinence is not required under the age of 14, it is laudable that parents teach children abstinence and other suitable acts penance as a way to learn and understand the true spirit of the Lenten season.
- <u>FAST</u> Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.
 - Over age 59, it is laudable to follow the discipline of fasting on these days, but one should not scruple about modifying or breaking the fast at this age when matters of health and well-being come into question.
 - Under age 59, when pregnant or nursing, performing significant manual labor, or suffering from a serious illness (a chronic illness such as diabetes or hypoglycemia, or a more immediate illness where fasting would not be healthy,) it may be morally impossible to follow this precept.
- To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

 "Seriously sinful" is a moral theologian's code word for "mortal sin," given a person acting with knowledge, freedom, and choice. 'Accidents' are not necessarily mortal sins, but may perhaps be a sign that one is not taking one's Lenten disciplines seriously enough, which may be a separate issue for one's conscience.


