Third Sunday in Lent

March 15, 2020

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



The next three weekends of Lent, we hear a series of stories from the Gospel of John which could be described as a 'tryptich'. A tryptich is an arrangement of icons or artwork in a threesome which are meant to go together. My grandma had what might be called a tryptich picture frame for her three grandkids, me in one frame, my brother in another, and my sister in a third—the three of us displayed together... until my other brother was born.

In the same way, John takes three scenes in the life of Jesus and spends some considerable time laying them out for us. Typically we read these stories every Lent to those

who are coming into the Church at Easter as meditations on Christ's desire to gather his people and save them. The First is the Samaritan Woman at the Well. This is an outcast woman from an outcast race, the Samaritans, who is searching for not only "living water", but for some clarity in her life. She had been married a number of times, but had not found satisfaction. Jesus approaches her as a supernatural suitor, one who is vying not simply for her affections, but for a supernatural love which she herself was perhaps not aware of.

The fourth week of Lent features the man born blind. The blindness experienced by the man was not merely a natural ailment. Jesus draws a new faith out of the man, opening not only his physical eyes, but his 'spiritual eyes' as well.

The final image comes to us from the story of the death of Lazarus. Here, we see Jesus interacting with Martha and Mary, asking them if they have faith in him. They reply as any of us would, "of course I have faith", but they do not know the full ramifications of that proclamation. Do you believe that the Son of Man has power over life and death... REAL live and death? "But Lord, if you open the tomb, won't there be a stench?" Martha believed, but in a very superficial or perhaps even 'symbolic' way. Yes, she believed in the Lord, but she had a very practical concern—you remove the stone from the tomb of a dead man and it will stink! But Jesus is not simply a symbolic god or one who speaks in metaphors. He actually intends and is able to raise Lazarus from the dead. All of those who saw the events of that day would have not only a worldly trust in Jesus, but a supernatural hope borne out of his power over life and death itself.

Each of these stories are meant to go together and are meant to build up the faith. Indeed, they are not simply "stories" or "narratives", but they are invitations for us to go deeper into who and what we believe Jesus to be. Do we really believe that he can satisfy the deepest longings of our heart? Do we believe that he can give us a new way of looking at the world? Do we really believe that he has true, and not simply symbolic, power over life and death? Finally, do we really believe that he is truly risen and working among us to reveal the path to eternal life? It is a legacy which we hand to new Catholics every year, but which we all must consider as we hear these powerful stories of faith and conversion.

Next Saturday, March 21, Bishop Paprocki will be at St. Anthony's for the First Communion and Confirmation of about 30 third graders at 1:00 pm. And then he will return for our regular 6:30 pm Mass to celebrate with an additional 45 confirmandi mostly drawn from our 7th and 8th grade classes at school and PSR. All are welcomed to attend these celebrations. Our regular 4:00pm Mass will take place as usual and, logistically speaking, should not be impacted by these other celebrations. I do ask our parishioners to pray for our confirmandi and first communicants and their families. This is a special day for those receiving the sacraments and for our entire parish.

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of our faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth!
