



A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

(written 11-April-20)



As the Lord bid his disciples on that First Day of the Resurrection, so I bid you and your families "Peace be with you!" It is with sadness that our parish does not gather as the visible Body of Christ on this most Holy Day of Days, but with trust in God, who leads us day by day and invites us to draw closer to him in this time of need.

During this powerful season of the year, the Apostolic Penitentiary... no, not a prison, but the ministry authorized by the pope to forgive the most serious sins reserved to

the Holy See, such as certain excommunications and sacramental impediments, but also to announce opportunities for indulgenced prayers and good works for the faithful... the Apostolic Penitentiary has issued special prayers for this time of need, centered on the celebration of Divine Mercy in this season.




In the decree, it is written that anyone with "the will to fulfill the 'usual conditions' (that is, sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion, and prayer according to the Holy Father's intentions,) as soon as possible," who recites the Divine Mercy Chaplet and has the intention "to implore from Almighty God the end of this epidemic, relief for those who are afflicted, and eternal salvation for those whom the Lord has called to Himself," can receive a plenary indulgence each day.

Some people are rightfully nervous anytime the Church talks about indulgences, given a sketchy history in some contexts, but the idea here is that our prayers and good work, joined in prayer to the sacrifice of the Lord himself, brings a special merit for his grace upon those who call upon him in faith. While the normal means of grace or impeded in this time, the Church does not want to abandon the faithful, but make this a time of intense prayer for all in need. Other opportunities for prayer include

- The Church also extends a plenary indulgence to those suffering from the disease itself, and those under quarantine by health authority in hospitals or in their own homes. They are invited and asked to unite spiritually with the celebration of the Mass and the pious recitation of the Holy Rosary and the Stations of the Cross and the will to fulfil the 'usual conditions' (above).
- Health Care workers may gain the indulgence who, by following the example of the Good Samaritan expose themselves to the risk of contagion while caring for the sick of the coronavirus, according to the words of the redeemer, "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends." (Jn 15:13) along with the same "usual conditions", above.
- Finally, those who visit the Blessed Sacrament (our church is open daily from 9am until about sundown) gains an Indulgence under all the same conditions, where they to pray, offer a Rosary, read scriptures, make the Way of the Cross, or recite the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, imploring the Lord for relief for those who are affected and eternal salvation for those the Lord has called to himself.

Happy Easter! You've Got A Reason To Smile!



Finally, the Church offers a Plenary Indulgence for those unable to receive the Anointing of the Sick and Viaticum, by entrusting the faithful to the Divine Mercy of God at the time of death, provided they are "duly disposed". It is recommended that the faithful have a cross or crucifix available to them for their prayer.

These are scary times, but these are also graced times. In order to help you pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet, we are providing fliers in the gathering space (vestibule) of the Church with instructions, as well as very nice page-sized mages of Divine Mercy- the image written about in St. Faustina's diary. One of the recommendations which I have recently heard, which I would like to pass on and recommend to our parishioners is to place an image of the Divine Mercy in your home for veneration, and the to "mark your doors with the Blood of the Savior" by placing an image in your doorway at home... not unlike the Israelites of ages gone by, who marked their doors at the first Passover with the blood of a lamb, such that we have a way not only to proclaim our faith in the Lamb once Slain who is risen again, but to invite others to proclaim, as was commanded to be written with the image, "Jesus, I trust in You!".
