#### A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

(written 6-May-2020)

In our scriptures, we hear about the Church making provisions, in the power of the Holy Sprit, to continue its mission and propagate itself to our own day. The Acts of the Apostles describe what can be understood as an early "ordination rite" in the selection of deacons to assist the apostles in their ministry. And so to this day, we continue to call on the Holy Spirit to give the Church ministers on whom the apostles lay hands and assign to ministries in our midst. The works of faith on part of these ministers echo through earth in a way that the gospel suggests is even greater than those seen from the hands of Christ! For today, the Good News of Jesus Christ reaches all people of the earth using media, travel, outreach and evangelization that so many hands make possible today through the ministry and life of the Church.

A couple of items: First, the Junefest chairpeople have decided to postpone the annual Junefest celebration scheduled for June 27. We hope to have some kind of festival at St. Dominic's later on in the year... perhaps in the fall after school starts again. We are going to hold the 3rd Annual Junefest Big Prize Raffle. This year, the raffle features cash prizes for the first three winners at \$25,000, \$10,000, and \$5,.000. Additional cash prizes will go to the next 47 winners. There will be 2000 tickets at \$50 apiece, with a modest reserve of 1200 tickets which must be sold



for the grand prizes to be given at these generous levels. The winners will be drawn in July at the St. Anthony Picnic, or if it is postponed or cancelled, on either a live Facebook/YouTube event and/or on a live TV event on the same date. As the QCES/QNDF Mega Raffle has been cancelled for this year, we anticipate increased demand for our raffle tickets this year. We hope to have them out in the next couple of weeks!

The parish office is going to reduce its hours to Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, 8am to noon, effective this week. We plan to return to regular hours sometime after we return to a regular, public Mass schedule.


The Sunday Mass time on YouTube and Facebook is officially at 9am for the "live" broadcast. The Mass will then be available throughout the day afterwards. You are welcome to use this webcast in whatever way is helpful to you— watch it all the way through, or tune in for just the readings or the readings and the homily... whatever is helpful—to keep the spirit of Sunday. We also webcast a Holy Hour each day at 3pm. Most of the time it is live at this hour, although sometimes in order to accommodate events at the parish, we do record it earlier in the day. Typically there are times of readings and then of silence. The rosary is usually presented 15-20 minutes after the beginning, and then the day's Evening Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours



is said 10-15 minutes before the end of the hour. Again, you are welcomed to use that webcast in whatever way is useful to you. Finally, confessions are being heard on Saturday afternoons from 4pm to 5pm. These schedules will be adjusted as we begin to re-start our public schedules at the guidance of the Bishop and the Diocese of Springfield. I anticipate that we will have only a partial restart at first, where those from vulnerable demographics are encouraged to stay home and where the attendance will be limited. I also expect that the precept to attend Mass will continue to be abrogated for the foreseeable future. We will continue to webcast at least until such time that things return to 'normal', which may yet be many months. We continue to pray and long for the re-assembly of God's people as a worshipping community on Sundays. Thank you for your continued patience, and we will continue to do our best to help our parishioners and families during these strange times.

#### Catholic Charities announces new COPE Line to help people deal with COVID-19 related stress

SPRINGFIELD - Catholic Charities Diocese of Springfield in Illinois announced a new community service starting April 13th called the "Catholic Charities COPE Line" for people who are experiencing situational stress and anxiety related to the Coronavirus Outbreak, the nonprofit agency announced today.

The service is free of charge and available to the public for people living in the 28-county service area of the Springfield Diocese. "During this time of confusion and uncertainty it is very important to respect our thoughts

and feelings, and to reach out when those thoughts and feelings become overwhelming," said Theresa Loy, L.C.P.C., Therapeutic Services Coordinator for Catholic Charities. "Sometimes people just need someone to talk to." The Catholic Charities COPE Line is not formal therapy or an emergency hotline. However, you will be referred for a conversation with a qualified Catholic Charities mental health professional who can

help you with effective coping strategies. There are no fees, enrollment forms or application processes.

"Catholic Charities is committed to helping those in need in the communities we serve. We want folks to know that they are not in this alone. Since many people are being asked to stay home to minimize the spread of this infectious disease, we want to reach out to them. We encourage anyone who may be struggling with managing their stress during this difficult time to call the COPE Line and schedule a talk with one of our professional and empathetic Catholic Charities therapists," Loy said. Calls will be accepted beginning Monday, April 13th, after the Easter break. To schedule an appointment, call 217-321-8343. You will be asked to leave your name, phone number, community of residence, and the best daytime hours to reach you. A certified therapist will return your call within 1 business day.




