A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

(written 14-May-2020)

Next weekend, we will be hosting Fr. Pawel Luczak for a "First Mass" in Quincy. He was originally scheduled to be ordained on May 23, but Bishop Paprocki moved this celebration up to May 2. Right now we are working on the presumption that the stay-at-home executive order will remain in place for next weekend, so his Mass will be webcast at the normal 9am time, followed by Communion Services at 11am at St. Anthony's and St. Dominic. I expect Fr. Pawel will be able to stay behind at St. Anthony for the Communion Service there. We congratulate Fr. Pawel on his ordination and welcome him to Quincy again as he now take his assignment as Parochial Vicar at the Church of St. Peter.



Bishop Paprocki sent a letter to the priests of the diocese just hours ago, which I still have to "digest" to make sure I completely understand what he is saying. It sounds like Cardinal Cupish of Chicago and Governor Pritzker have come to an agreement to let Chicago Churches open on a modified timeline and scale which will be accommodated by the governor's ongoing executive order. In turn, the rest of the bishops and dioceses of Illinois will be participating in this plan. Of course, Chicago is "behind" where we are already, downstate, in our re-opening plan/schedule due to the severity of the disease in the metropolitan area. So it sounds like there is movement afoot, but there are no announcements, yet. I almost dread writing anything as events can change so very quickly, but I wanted to let you all know what kind of work is going on behind the scenes to bring back "public Masses". I expect that it will be a coordinated effort on part of both Church and civil leadership, with the health and safety of the community at mind and heart, which is ultimately going to see us to the end of this crisis.



More COVID-19 event news: Having already postponed the Junefest celebration, we have now decided, due to the ongoing health crisis, and in the interest of protecting our parishioners and others who are vulnerable, to postpone the St. Anthony Picnic as well. This is a hard decision to have to make, but I be-

lieve it is the correct decision for now— not only in the interest of public health, but because of the risk involved with trying to predict the status of the "stay-at-home" executive order in the future. Our Junefest and St. Anthony Picnic chair-people spend months preparing these events and have waited to the last possible moment (with respect to all their planning) to make this very tough decision. We hope that perhaps we can have a parish-wide celebration later on in the year... indeed, we will all need a good strong adult beverage and a tenderloin sandwich when this is all finished!

For many, there will be a concern about the lost revenue from these events. Usually the combined amount from these events is in excess of \$60,000 (which is the best part of two payrolls... that is, one month's worth of payroll expenses). This is a significant concern, but not an insurmountable tragedy. We are planning on having the "Junefest Big Prize Raffle" with a drawing in July. The top prize there will be \$25,000, and the potential revenue to the parish with a sell-out (2000 tickets at \$50 each) is about \$50,000. We will also hold the \$1,000 St. Anthony Picnic Raffle and Quilt Raffle. These letters asking your support are going to be arriving in mailboxes over the next few weeks. I invite you to consider supporting these events, recognizing that maybe this is the year for a "no-picnic picnic" donation? We also completely understand that there are some out there who have been so severely negatively impacted by the closure of their small business or from layoffs and work furloughs... we can ask nothing more of you. We thank you all the same for your consideration and for your past support!

Catholic Charities announces new COPE Line to help people deal with COVID-19 related stress

SPRINGFIELD – Catholic Charities Diocese of Springfield in Illinois announced a new community service **starting April 13th** called the "Catholic Charities COPE Line" for people who are experiencing situational stress and anxiety related to the Coronavirus Outbreak, the nonprofit agency announced today.

The service is free of charge and available to the public for people living in the 28-county service area of the Springfield Diocese. "During this time of confusion and uncertainty it is very important to respect our thoughts

and feelings, and to reach out when those thoughts and feelings become overwhelming," said Theresa Loy, L.C.P.C., Therapeutic Services Coordinator for Catholic Charities. "Sometimes people just need someone to talk to." The Catholic Charities COPE Line is not formal therapy or an emergency hotline. However, you will be referred for a conversation

with a qualified Catholic Charities mental

health professional who can help you with ef-

fective coping strategies. There are no fees, enrollment forms or application processes.

"Catholic Charities is committed to helping those in need in the communities we serve. We want folks to know that they are not in this alone. Since many people are being asked to stay home to minimize the spread of this infectious disease, we want to reach out to them. We encourage anyone who may be struggling with managing their stress during this difficult time to call the COPE Line and schedule a talk with one of our professional and empathetic Catholic Charities therapists," Loy said.

Calls will be accepted beginning Monday, April 13th, after the Easter break. To schedule an appointment, call 217-321-8343. You will be asked to leave your name, phone number, community of residence, and the best daytime hours to reach you. A certified therapist will return your call within 1 business day.
