A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

(written 22-May-2020)



The Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord commemorates the day when Jesus rose from the earth to be with God the Father in heaven, By his promise, we will not be abandoned or orphaned, but rather, as children of God, we will receive a new revelation in the presence and power of God, the Holy Spirit. Our Easter celebration is not so much 'over' as it is becoming 'complete' with the observances of these two major solemnities of our faith.

Welcome to Fr. Pawel Luczak who is celebrating Mass with us at St. Anthony this weekend. We congratulate him on his recent ordination and welcome him to Quincy as



the new parochial vicar at the Church of St. Peter on July 1. When a priest celebrates Mass, he fulfills the charge given him by the ordaining bishop who, as he hands the ordinand a chalice with bread and wine, says, "Receive from the Holy People of God the gifts to be offered to God. Know what you do, imitate what you celebrate, and conform your life to the mystery of the Lord's cross.

The latest from Springfield: the priests of the diocese received a letter from the bishop on Thursday of this week, outlining some of the details of our 'restart' plan. It



seems that perhaps we will be targeting the first weekend of June (June 7th) or later, and that there will be attendance limits, perhaps based on a percentage of occupancy of the building. Of particular note, it appears there will be training for greeters and other 'helpers' who will be necessary for the proper functioning of our churches for the time immediately after the 'restart'. By this, it appears that there will be people at the door who will be counting those who enter the church, stopping entrance when the limit is reached. While I don't want to get into the argument of whether wearing masks is actually effective or not, this may be a legitimate requirement


which is imposed upon us by the state and the bishop. As for the other 'helpers', there will be the expectation that the church is 'cleaned' between crowds in attendance, which would include pews, doorknobs, bathrooms, and other surfaces likely to be touched. In any case, Mass attendance will not be obligatory, probably, for some time, and those who attend will be warned that, despite our best efforts, we cannot guarantee a safe environment where nobody will become sick. Those who are sick, potentially exposed to the virus, or simply in vulnerable demographics will be urged to stay home.

This is certainly not optimal, but I want to prepare our parishioners for the type of regime we might have to deal with for a while. My intention is to do whatever we can to make the sacraments as freely and as safely available as possible while following the legitimate guidelines of our bishop and state/local health authorities. I ask your assistance and cooperation when we send out the call for training and then help, which may be this week or next week.

good stewards of God's varied grace (1 Pt 4:10).



A new wrinkle from this week's letter is that the bishop is conceding the privilege of offering our young people First Communion and Confirmation to pastors, once it becomes possible to celebrate Mass publicly. This

means that I will have the faculty to celebrate Confirmation with our young people. I need to talk with Bonnie Nytes, our DRE, and Carol Frericks, our school principal, to come up with a plan on how to celebrate these sacraments. Likely we will schedule multiple small groups to receive these sacraments over a number of weekends, but that has not been decided yet. Those who wish to wait and receive the sacraments from the hands of Bishop Paprocki will also have a time designated, probably sometime this fall where that can be possible as well. I invite you to continue to pray for our 8th grade graduates and 7th graders-turning-8th-graders who are to receive Confirmation, as well as our 3rd-graders-turning-4th-graders who are to receive Holy Communion (finally!) and Confirmation.

O Mary, you shine continuously on our journey as a sign of salvation and hope.

We entrust ourselves to you, Health of the Sick.

At the foot of the Cross you participated in Jesus' pain, with steadfast faith.

You, Salvation of the Roman People, know what we need. We are certain that you will provide, so that,

Catholic Charities announces new COPE Line to help people deal with COVID-19 related stress

SPRINGFIELD – Catholic Charities Diocese of Springfield in Illinois announced a new community service called the "Catholic Charities COPE Line" for people who are experiencing situational stress and anxiety related to the Coronavirus Outbreak, the nonprofit agency announced today.

The service is free of charge and available to the public for people living in the 28-county service area of the Springfield Diocese. The Catholic Charities COPE Line is not formal therapy or an emergency hotline. However,

you will be referred for a conversation with a qualified Catholic Charities mental health professional who can help you with effective coping strategies. There are no fees, enrollment forms or application processes.

We encourage anyone who may be struggling with managing their stress during this difficult time to call the COPE Line and schedule a talk with one of our professional and empathetic Catholic Charities therapists," Loy said.

To schedule an appointment, call 217-321-8343. You will be asked to leave your name, phone number, community of residence, and the best daytime hours to reach you. A certified therapist will return your call within 1 business day. As with all Catholic Charities programs, this service is open to the public including people of all faiths, race, age and individual circumstances.
