A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:




Pentecost Sunday marks the fulfillment, but not the end of the Easter season. It is through the Holy Spirit that God reveals himself in the world and in the Church. The Holy Eucharist is made visible through the eyes of faith as the Spirit is invoked over the bread and the wine: "Let your Spirit come upon these gifts to make the holy, that they may become for us the Body and Blood of your Sou, Our Lord Jesus Christ." Priests, deacons, and bishops are ordained by the laying on of hands and invocation of the Holy Spirit. Indeed,

all of the sacraments have a sign of hands and a calling for the of the Spirit upon those receiving the sacraments.

Like Mary, whose openness to the will of God allowed the Holy Spirit to overshadow her, permitting the Eternal Word to be made flesh and dwell among us, the Holy Spirit's power is seen most clearly in the hearts and minds and hands of those who are open and welcoming to the gifts the spirit showers down upon God's people. This is the promise of Pentecost— that as we humbly give ourselves into the will of God, it is He whose breath breathes through us as a mighty wind: invisible in its presence, but powerful in its effects.

I have had a preliminary chat with our parish staff on how we are going to celebrate First Communions and Confirmation in the parish now that Bishop Paprocki has delegated pastors to celebrate these sacraments in their parishes. We still have to make final decisions, but we are looking at having a series of celebrations towards the end of July and the beginning of August, depending on the progress of 'phases' for reopening. Stay tuned. We are going to try to accommodate families as best we can with options and opportunities for dates and the ability to welcome guest and extended family members for these important celebrations. Please help our young people preparing for these sacraments to maintain their readiness and excitement for the coming of our Lord in the Eucharist and the coming of the Spirit in Confirmation!





Finally, I received word and was asked to pass the news that **Sr. Marie Ambrose Peters, SSND**, a former teacher at Notre Dame High School in Quincy died on May 23, at the motherhouse in Bridgeton, MO. She was eighty-nine years old and in the sixty-fifth year of her religious profession. While I did not know sister personally, I am glad that members of our parish keep track of those religious sisters who were important in their educational and spiritual formation over the years. I also want to be able to publish notices like this, not only reminding our parish community to pray for those who have shared our journey of faith and have gone on to their eternal reward, but to also remind us all to pray for vocations to religious life. Nowadays it is a rare and beautiful vocation to be called to religious

life— to live under vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience, which are strengthened by God grace during the challenges, consolations, and rewards of everyday life and life in religious community. Please pray for Sr. Marie Ambrose and for those who will follow into the adventure of giving themselves into total service of God and His Church.

Eternal rest grant to her, Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon her!


