

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

(written 4-June-2020)



Welcome! There is a lot to say about our return to public Masses and all of the novelties we are having to deal with, but I'll deal with those details elsewhere. Please bear with us and each other as we learn to negotiate these new situation we are dealing with. Hopefully in a reasonable amount of time, we can continue layer in more elements of 'normalcy' in our family lives and in our parish life.

I am aware that there is likely a large number of our parishioners who are still uncomfortable with being out in public and being in the relatively-close quarters as one might

experience in church. Remember that the Sunday Mass obligation remains abrogated and that you should take full advantage of this if you are fearful for your health or that of your family members. Besides the Sunday Mass experience, we are hoping to be able to generously offer opportunities to ease back into the practice of the faith by offering ongoing webcasts as we have been doing, by providing opportunities to receive Holy Communion outside of Mass, and by encouraging attendance at daily Mass during the week when our crowds tend to be around only a dozen or so.

The nature of the COVID disease means that we cannot guarantee, despite our best efforts, that it is not possible to contract the disease. Things happen when people meet in a public forum. People sneeze. Children put things in their mouths. Some people believe that everyone should be wearing protective masks and others believe just the opposite... and the experts are truly divided about this entire issue. I ask that if you observe unsafe behavior or what you perceive to be unsafe behavior from other persons, that you tactfully ask for your neighbor to fix it. If you are asked to wear a mask or sanitize your hands or provide greater distance from another person that you tactfully accept this request and not take it personally or in offense. One of the most challenging aspects of this time of returning to Mass might very well become a terrible tool of Satan himself... we need to be extremely conscious of the community and individual efforts to be welcoming and hospitable to all of our parishioners and visitors. I do not want to hear about people being alienated from practicing their faith because of misunderstandings and various kinds of hurt feelings that might result from these weeks and months... sometimes those hurt feelings alienate people for years or decades—or even the rest of a lifetime—before they are fixed. So once again, I urge everyone to be careful and gentle with each other, understanding of the distress of these days, and accommodating to reasonable requests. Let's not let the devil himself undermine the reunion that we have been praying for over the last few months!

The Holy Trinity is not an abstract theological construct, but it is instead a living reality of our faith. Our relationship to the Godhead is through our status as adopted sons and daughters in Christ. Thus, our place within the love of the Trinity is in and through Christ, "who lives and reigns with you [God the Father] and the Holy Spirit, One God forever and ever." All authentic prayer acknowledges this Triune God, and is directed to him. At Mass, listen carefully to whom the different prayers are directed. The Eucharistic Prayers, which make Jesus present are directed to God the Father, through the power of the Holy Spirit. Other prayers, such as the Sign of the Cross, the Glory to God, and the Creed are Trinitarian prayers. Trinity Sunday is presented to the Church to help us become more conscious of the reality of God and his desire to share his love with us. Divine Love is the reason for God's work to redeem his people after they fell. Divine Love remains the reason God works within the Church today to unite all men and women in the hope of the Kingdom of Heaven.
