A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

(written 10-June-2020)



Our first and, by time you read this, our second week-end of resumed Sunday Masses are now complete. I am expecting to receive word that, as the State of Illinois proceeds at the end of June to "Phase IV" of its five-phase plan for re-opening following the coronavirus crisis, that we will be receiving additional directives on how to handle public Masses and other gatherings. Thank you for your patience and understanding during this period of transition. It is certainly not an optimal situation, but we are doing our best to minimize the confusion and wrinkles that may occur, to properly implement orders coming from civil and church authorities, and then communicate to you, our parishioners effectively. Please continue to keep informed of events by social media and our parish web page. Also, please try to spread news to those who are less inclined to use these high-tech means of communication, so that the word spreads as far and wide as possible for any changes that may take place.

We sent a notice home this week about Confirmation and First Communion classes. We are hoping to have the third... er... *fourth* grade First Communion and Confirmations on the weekend of July 25 and 26. Then our older confirmandi on August 1st and 2nd. I have been delegated to celebrate Confirmation on behalf of Bishop Paprocki due to the unusual circumstances with which we have been dealing. If there are issues regarding the suitability of this date, or if there are confirmands who would like to defer until a time when Bishop Paprocki can celebrate this sacrament in person, please contact the parish office as soon as possible so that we can make alternate arrangements.



This week's Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ is an after-echo of the celebration of Holy Thursday. Indeed, the true date of Corpus Christi is the *Thursday* after Trinity Sunday, but in almost the entire world outside of Rome, the Solemnity is transferred to the following Sunday... today. Similarly, the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which is celebrated this coming Friday, is meant to be an after-echo of the sacrifice of Good Friday, projected out into this time after the Easter Season has completed. Why does the Church have these feasts separate from the Easter celebration? Is not the fullest understanding of the Eucharist and the Sacred Heart of Jesus understood in the context of the drama of Holy Week? Of course it is. But, I think the wisdom of the Church is that we have these celebrations in the midst of trying to "return to normal" after fifty days of singing "Alleluia" during the Easter Season. Indeed, this year, as most of the faithful were unable to attend Mass during Holy Week and Easter, this is a different kind of observance where things are "returning to normal". Hopefully in the involuntary "Eucharistic Fast" of ten weeks, there is a realization on part of the faithful of how central Holy Communion is to the life of faith. Hopefully there is a renaissance in the importance of sacred worship with the gathered community each Sunday. I pray that the protection afforded our community by the providence of a merciful God, who indeed dwells among us, may continue to keep our parishioners and their families safe from disease and harm. *O Sacrament Most Holy! O Sacrament Divine! All praise and all thanksgiving be every moment Thine!*

Postponed

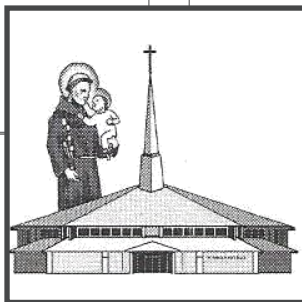
