July 19, 2020 — Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



The next two weekends we will be celebrating Confirmation and Confirmation with First Communion at our Sunday Masses. Under the current attendance restrictions, this is going to cause some problems, which I had hoped would be beyond at this point, but alas, we are still dealing with them. Both next week (July 25/26) and the week after (August 1/2), our 6:30pm and 10:30am Masses in the Church are being reserved for the Confirmandi and their guests, and I expect the church to be full for each celebration.

So how are we going to resolve this? We cannot have people who are used to attending the 6:30pm or 10:30am Mass go to the other Masses on the weekend, as these Masses have generally been full each weekend. Rather than confusing people by re-opening St. Dominic (which is not a good solution because of the air conditioning situation), I am going to ask that if you have been going to the 6:30pm Mass on Saturday night or the 10:30am Mass on Sunday morning, please attend a second Mass which will be celebrated on-site, in the parish hall (cafeteria) for the next two weekends at those times. This is certainly not optimal, but it is a way to solve the happy problem that we have so many people who want to go to Mass.

By cooperating with this request, it will hopefully save us from having to implement a “pre-sign-up” plan which is taking place in the other parishes. I have nothing against doing this if we have to in order to maintain our attendance limits, but I do think that adding this step makes it harder for people to come to Mass, especially those who are not so comfortable with the Internet. I ask, I beg your cooperation in this matter, so that we can continue to cooperate with the effort to keep people safer and healthier by social distancing and limiting the number of people in church.

if you have been going to the 6:30pm or the 10:30 am Mass, please plan to attend a second Mass which will be celebrated on-site, in the parish hall for the next two weekends at those times.

More on Mass Intentions: Last weekend, I explained how the tradition of offering “Mass Intentions” for the dead and for other intentions goes back to the early Church. The merits from these intentions flow from the inestimable grace flowing from each Mass, not only inviting the prayers of the faithful for our dearly departed, but also engaging the priest in offering the special fruits that comes from his ministerial participation in the Holy Sacrifice. Each weekend and each Holy Day of Obligation, pastors of parishes throughout the world are expected to offer Mass on behalf of “the people”. Traditionally this is called the “*Missa pro Populo*”, but here at St. Anthony’s it has commonly been called the “Parish Intentions” each week. This Mass intention asks the pastor to remember all of those entrusted to his care, living and dead. Normally the pastor himself celebrates this intention in person at one of the Masses of the weekend (which is something that takes a bit of coordination when intentions have been set for months beforehand and, as we now have, there is a second priest such as Fr. Blickhan helping out!) When I go on vacation or am otherwise away from the parish, I celebrate my own Sunday Mass ‘for the people’... even priests need remember to go to Mass each and every Sunday when they are on vacation or away! The other Mass intentions that you see through the week are requested by the faithful on behalf of those they wish to have remembered at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Next week, I’ll talk about the procedures we are implementing to try to make this process of requesting a Mass intention a bit easier and more fair to all who would wish to remember a loved one at Mass.

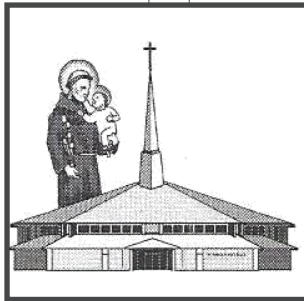
