**A bit more on 'Mass Intentions':** The last several weeks, I have used this space to chat a bit about "Mass Intentions" and the practice of having the priest remember people at Mass. Two weeks ago, I talked a little bit about the history and the church's understanding of what we are doing when we offer an "intention" at Mass. Last week, I mentioned the importance of the "Mass for the People" on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. This week, I want provide some practical information of how we are re-organizing the offering of Mass Intentions at St. Anthony's.

At each Mass, not otherwise requiring a "Mass for the People", our parish collects intentions and donations (customarily \$10 per Mass) for scheduling intentions. Normally such intentions are for the deceased and will be presumed as such, unless we are informed otherwise. (For instance, if someone we are praying for is simply sick, we need to know and indicate that, so we don't include them among the "dead" during the Intercessions.) We also reserve the right not to schedule or publish intentions which, normally by the discretion of the priest involved, would be considered problematic, inappropriate, or scandalous. For instance, we would not accept an intention for "Jane Doe, candidate for mayor", "for victory in war against our godless enemies", or a Mass for a notorious criminal. Sometimes the needs of charity and mercy call for such requests to be taken and listed as an unspecified "Special Intention", but it is strongly preferred that the public be able to join in the specific (rather than 'virtual') intention belonging to each Mass.

The parish is only allowed to keep about one year's worth of intentions on our books to be scheduled in as fair a manner as possible. The hope is that as many people as possible can have the ability to have Mass said for a loved one. Sometimes people place in their estates that several thousand dollars worth of Masses be said for the repose of the soul of the testator. We will do our best to honor this request, but in the strictest reading of Canon Law, we must send intentions which we cannot satisfy within one year to other priests who can satisfy the requests... these are normally missionaries and other priests who need the daily support of the \$10 Mass "stipend". We must therefore reserve the right to pass on excess intentions which come to us in this manner. By extension, we are not supposed to accept intentions for successive years (every occurrence of a particular date for the next ten years, for instance). I can neither accept such an obligation for myself nor impose it on a future pastor who might come into the parish.

Finally, in order that all might have access to having Masses celebrated for their loved ones, we typically ask that a name appear no more than once a month at a weekend Mass. Indeed, in order to spread out the intentions across the various Masses celebrated all week long, we are going to ask that if multiple intentions are presented, that they should be spread out with no more than 1/2 on weekends, and at least 1/2 on weekdays. We will do our best to satisfy requests for specific dates (anniversaries of birth, death, etc). But if a date is already chosen and we are requested to add a second intention to that day because of the personal importance of the day, we must have permission of both in order to set a day with a double intention. Finally, I am going to ask our secretaries to insure that particular intentions scheduled on Christmas, Easter, or other high-holy days occur no more than once every three years. I also intend to hold back one such intention to myself on each of these holidays in order to be able to offer it to those who are suffering a 'fresh' loss at the holidays. This is sometimes the gift that brings entire families back to Church and makes the holiday season just a little more bearable.

I may have one last follow-up on Mass Intentions next week to finish my thoughts, but I think I managed to communicate everything I needed to say in anticipation of opening our Intention Book for 2021. That book will open on Tuesday, August 11 during regular parish office hours.

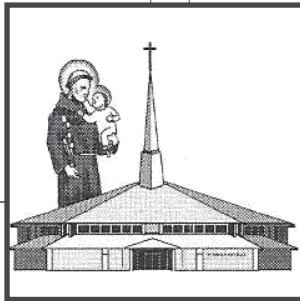
