August 9, 2020 — Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



"Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward Jesus. But when he saw how strong the wind was, he became frightened." How can we describe Peter? At once faithful and fearful, his jumbled responses remind us that he was no spiritual superman, well-intentioned though he may have been. Peter wanted to believe, and in fact showed a great deal of confidence in Christ. But his temptation to doubt was strong enough to knock him off his feet, literally.

"O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" Jesus reprimanded Peter. The words seem harsh. After all, out of all the disciples, Peter was the only one who had enough faith to even try something as ludicrous as stepping out of the boat onto the water in the first place. But perhaps Jesus wanted to emphasize that our faith needs to be strong enough to weather the storm, so to speak.

If we only believe in Jesus when the wind is calm and the waves are gone, is that truly having faith in him? Is that actually trusting in his supreme power over the forces of the universe? Peter sank as soon as a challenge appeared. Jesus called him, and he calls us, to stay on our feet as the winds begin to blow. So, what are the winds that threaten our faith? What kinds of gusts are blowing today? Whatever it might be, none of it is too much for Jesus to handle. But we must step out in faith and trust him! And we need to keep our eyes on him as we do so, instead of getting distracted by the force of the challenges we face. We have nothing to fear as long as we are walking towards him.

Health Update: This week I met with representatives of the Adams County Emergency Services office and the Health Department on a conference call with over 40 other pastors, learning about the COVID situation in Adams County. We are in grave danger of having another 'stay at home order' imposed which would shut down not only churches, but restaurants, stores, and other public spaces until the local infection rate declines. Our public officials are acutely aware of the negative economic and social impact such an action would bring about, and so they are making the request that we redouble the efforts to social distance, encourage all in attendance at churches to wear face coverings, and to practice outstanding hand hygiene. I am passing this request on. Collectively the Catholic churches have one of the most comprehensive sets of countermeasures in place, but that doesn't mean that it can't happen to us or that we can relax our anti-COViD posture. I am passing this request from the health department to you, asking that, rather than implementing a voluntary closure of our church (which I will not accept, barring the explicit instruction from the bishop) that all Mass attendees wear some kind of facial covering, effective as soon as reasonably possible. Thank you for your patience with this evolving situation and all of the small annoyances which have been imposed. With the grace and protection of God's Divine Mercy, I look forward to this crisis being over as soon as we can all manage it!

Saturday, August 15 is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. normally a Holy Day of Obligation, except for when it falls on Saturday and except for the fact that Mass obligations are presently cancelled due to the health crisis. Nonetheless, we will have Mass on Saturday Morning, August 15 at 9am in honor of this solemnity. Because of the special favor extended to Mary by way of her Immaculate Conception, Mary left this world at the end of her life without sin or concupiscence. Where she had the prevenient grace of salvation that illustrates the glory of humanity raised to its highest perfection, we follow day-by-day, growing in faith and hope in the grace of our Lord who will call us to himself at the redemption of the world. When we gather on great Marian feasts like this, we worship God alone who works great feats of grace in those whose hearts are open to him... the first of whom includes Mary, honored as the Mother of Christ our Lord and Mother of the Church.

PROTECTING GOD"S CHILDREN ONLINE TRAINING

We have received this from the Diocese of Springfield regarding PGC training.

"If an individual in your parish or school needs this training, we are currently offering an online alternative. Here are the step-by-step instructions of how to complete this online training:

- 1. Visit https://www.virtusonline.org/virtus/index.cfm
- 2. Click on "First-Time Registrant" and follow the account registration process.
- 3. Once you have submitted your account registration for approval, contact your parish/school safe environment coordinator and let them know you are awaiting the online

tor and let them know you are awaiti training assignment.

The parish/school safe environment coordinator will inform the Office for Safe Environment, your VIR-TUS account will be approved, and you will be assigned the online Protecting God's Children training through this account.

4. To access the online training, log in to your VIRTUS account. At the top of the page, click on the "Training" tab. On this page you should see the "Protecting God's Children Online

Awareness Session." Click the title of the training to begin. NOTE: from that date the training was assigned, you will have 30 days to complete this session.

 Once you have completed this training, you will always have access to your certificate of completion on your VIRTUS account. "

This training only needs to be completed once. Each year we are audited by the Diocese to determine if we are in compliance with this policy in order to keep our young people safe.
