"Am I my brother's keeper?" This question haunts the fourth chapter of Genesis after Cain commits the first murder and echoes throughout Sacred Scripture. The obvious answer is, "of course!" We are responsible for our brothers and sisters, not only for bodily safety, but also for his or her spiritual welfare. Indeed, the prophet Ezekiel reminds us that we must warn the wicked of their ways, and in doing so save not only their life, but ours as well! (Ez 33: 7-9)

These seem harsh words, but they are consistent with the great lengths Jesus calls his disciples to seek reconciliation with the wayward brother in Matthew 18. We are to tell him his fault... we gather witnesses... we involve the church... and then we treat them as Gentile or tax collector, which also obligates the disciple of Christ to treat the wayward brother with love. For "Love does no evil to the neighbor; hence, love is the fulfillment of the Law." (Rom 13:10)

The Church recognizes the efforts to 'admonish the sinner' as one of the seven 'spiritual works of mercy'. Most people dislike conflict. Fewer people enjoy being corrected. It is natural to become defensive. It is hard to speak up, and doing so seems to run counter to the modern trend of not being 'judgmental'. It is sometimes hard to separate 'fraternal correction' from our own anger. But this is what we are 'on' for as followers of Christ. We are our 'brothers' keepers', and if we can save them from their faults, we win our brothers and sisters from the evil one.

This week I am going to be on my annual retreat. The parish office remains open during regular hours and can reach me as might be necessary. Our Deacon Candidate, Dennis Holbrook will offer Communion Services on Tuesday and Thursday morning. There will be no Mass on Monday or Friday. St. Dominic School will have a Communion Service on Wednesday.



Parishioners will find envelope marked "debt reduction" in their packets this month. For a number of years we have run about \$100,000 in 'last year's' obligations (normally about \$50,000 of the Annual Catholic Services Appeal and about \$50,000 of lay pension obligations) into the following fiscal year. I have 'drawn a line in the sand', setting these past obligations aside as 'debt' so that we can concentrate on taking care of 'this-year' obligations with the cash flow and

resources that come from this year. I hope you will stand with me in being committed to running a balanced budget within each fiscal year as best as we can in the Lord's providence. This is the first, best thing we can do to keep our financial house in order... and it is a lot easier to communicate what our real needs are when we are not 'robbing Peter to pay Paul' through multiple-financial-period slight-of-hand. What I ask is your continued support of the parish through the regular offertory and envelopes. This is our first priority. Afterwards, if you have a special gift you would be able to offer in order to help relieve these other past obligations, we would appreciate any additional gift after your regular offering, to help us with this debt. Thank you!

Starting next weekend, in response to ongoing maximum capacity attendances at the 4:00pm, 8:00am, and 10:30am Masses, we will try adding a Mass at 4:00pm on Sunday to try to distribute the crowds a bit more evenly. Weather permitting, we will try to offer this Mass on the front lawn at St. Anthony's, such that the ultraviolet light from the sun and hopefully a gentle breeze will help keep the environment safer for all who would wish to attend.... this is the strongest preference of the Adams County Health Department for how they would like to see church congregations meet... outside! Please bring a lawn chair or blanket and please maintain safe distances from others and have a mask available for when you are unable to keep that distance. This Mass will be offered only as long as it is necessary during the COVID crisis. I would also like to ask a few families who are attending one of the 'regular' Masses over the weekend to consider attendance on Saturday at 6:30pm or at this 'extra' Mass on Sunday in order to keep our Mass attendances at other times within the published maximum capacity of 100 people.
