More on the “Common Good”... Last week, I began a bulletin series on the obligation of Catholics to carefully consider their vote and to strive for the promotion of the “Common Good”. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops offer a reflection on our obligations as citizens and Catholics in their document, *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*. This tract was first written about twenty years ago, and has been updated in each four-year election cycle since. Some people will criticize it for being not specific enough on Catholic teaching. Still others criticize it for the fact that perhaps the Church should completely stay out of politics and respect a supposed-“Church-State” division that should not be crossed. The bishops address this second issue, addressing the role of Catholics in civil government:

Some question whether it is appropriate for the Church to play a role in political life. However, the obligation to teach the moral truths that should shape our lives, including our public lives, is central to the mission given to the Church by Jesus Christ. Moreover, the United States Constitution protects the right of individual believers and religious bodies to participate and speak out without government interference, favoritism, or discrimination. Civil law should fully recognize and protect the right of the Church and other institutions in civil society to participate in cultural, political, and economic life without being forced to abandon or ignore their central moral convictions. Our nation's tradition of pluralism is enhanced, not threatened, when religious groups and people of faith bring their convictions and concerns into public life. Indeed, our Church's teaching is in accord with the foundational values that have shaped our nation's history: "life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness." (Forming Consciences... 2020, USCCB, 11)

Catholics bring important insights about human nature and human morality, not only affirmed by Scripture, but visible in centuries of real-life human experience from ministering to the poor, the homeless, those experiencing difficult or unexpected pregnancies, by serving orphans, educating the young, feeding the hungry, consoling the imprisoned, welcoming immigrants and refugees, pursuing science, promoting global peace and solidarity, and promoting the dignity of each human being created in the image and likeness of God. It is precisely *because* we are engaged in these ministries that Catholics have much to offer from our Tradition, and that we should confidently draw on that wisdom to inform our consciences as prepare to vote.

Deacon Harry Cramer continues to heal from a recent surgery. We look forward to him returning to ministry as soon as he is able.

Deacon Candidate Dennis Holbrook received the Ministry (formerly the “minor order”) of Acolyte, at the hands of Bishop Paprocki in September. This Ministry anticipates his ministry as Deacon, which is conformed to the sacred mysteries of the altar and its Sacrifice. While it is typical for young people to serve in the role of acolyte (server) and for other lay people to serve as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (EOMHC) without the particular blessing that comes through the formal installation in this Ministry, this ritual moment is a way to remind the candidate for Holy Orders of the responsibilities that are becoming more and more perfected in them and reminds the Church of the dignity attached to these ministries.



The **Deacon Formation Team** of the Diocese of Springfield is reopening its call for applications this fall, for candidates to join a new

class forming up in the next year or so. Our deacon candidates receive five to six years of intense formational training, in anticipation of ordination, and then have a program of ongoing formation which follows being ordained as a deacon. Deacons serve the Church by being “dedicated to the People of God in the ministry of the Liturgy, of the Word, and of Charity” (*Lumen gentium* 29). Married or unmarried Catholic men between 32 and about 60, married for at least 7 years and with his wife’s consent, if married, and of good health, academic ability, and reputation are welcomed to apply. 
