A Message from Deacon Harry Cramer:

All Saints and All Souls Days: October is that month of transition when we begin to anticipate the magnificent fall colors as the air cools. Pumpkins begin to appear and fall flavors find their way to the table-fall is in the air. All too soon, we begin to think of Thanksgiving delights and some begin to count the days until Christmas. In this time, our church encourages us to pause and reflect on the saints and souls who have and continue to influence our lives. We are called to celebrate their lives by turning to prayer. Let's look at each day in the liturgical year.

The Solemnity of All Saints: A Solemnity wherein the church acknowledges all saints, known and unknown to us but known to God. It is observed on November 1 in our western church. We are encouraged by our Catholic Church to attend mass as this is a Holiday of Obligation. This Solemnity arose from the tradition in the early church honoring the martyrs. The martyrs sacrifice and witness of their faith was greatly revered and their places and dates of death were blessed by the candles, prayers, and votive offerings by the faithful. By the Fourth Century, there were so many martyrs, it became impossible to honor each individually in the Church's calendar. Over the following centuries various regions came to recognize these holy ones on one day and in different ways. By the early eighth-century, a Feast of All Saints was celebrated in Rome on November 1. The Feast was extended to the entire Church in the next century. The Eastern Church celebrates All Saints in spring of the year.

All Souls Day: All Souls Day is credited to Odilo who was Abbot of Cluny (c. 962-1049). Cluny was a Benedictine monastery in France. The day was instituted as a general day of prayer following All Saints Day. All Souls Day became a church-wide observance by the end of the 13th century. We are called to pray for all of those who have departed this world with the sign of faith that they may rest in Christ. The faithful are invited to especially pray for those souls in Purgatory. Although this is not a Holy day of Obligation, we are encouraged to attend mass and spend time in prayer for our beloved dead.

Activities: It is common for many to celebrate Halloween on or about October 31. Halloween derives from All Hallows Eve or the Eve of All Saints and is connected to the Solemnity of All Saints and in a larger way to All Souls Day. For many, the celebration activities of All Hallows Eve has traditionally followed Pagan forms. The church encourages us to consider the faith connotations by incorporating alternative activities that honors the saints and our beloved dead. There are numerous ideas from having kids dressing as their favorite saint, to having an All Saints Day party and even craft projects commemorating a favorite saint.

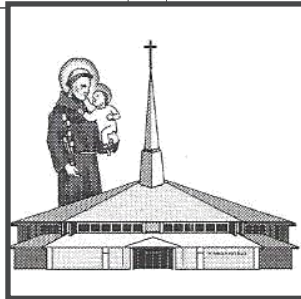
