A Message from Father Tom Donovan



St. Paul speaks to his audience in Thessalonica, trying to allay their concerns about those who have died. The proclamation of the Resurrection of Jesus and the affirmation of life after death made a few early Christians question if loved ones who have 'fallen asleep' might have 'missed out' on that Good News. Paul offers a rousing proclamation of faith which echoes in the Church to our own day:

If we believe that Jesus died and rose, so too will God, through Jesus, bring with him those who have fallen asleep... we who are alive will surely not precede those who have fallen asleep. For the Lord himself, with a word of command, with the voice of an archangel and with the

trumpet of God will come down from heaven and the dead in Christ shall rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. Thus we shall always be in the Lord.

One of the most powerful parts of the Christian Funeral is the opportunity it provides for the faithful to console each other with these words, as Paul instructs his audience to do. I commend our parish on the way it celebrates funerals: the luncheons, the special care for vigil services when they are at church, the attention put into the maintenance and upkeep of the parish cemetery, the notes and outreach that the community gives to those who mourn, the ongoing work of our *GriefShare* group, and all the unseen kindnesses which our parishioners share.

The process of grieving for lost loved ones in not only a spiritual and relational trauma, but it is one that echoes in our primal being, causing confusion, anger, concern, denial... all of the righteous feelings of loss. But it is when the larger community can surround and embrace those who are disoriented in the midst of loss that greater faith can be found. Faith does not take away the reality of the loss, nor does it merely cover up 'bad' feelings with more 'acceptable' feelings. Faith helps us to realize the greatest reality of our humanity and the greatest hope for our loved ones who have passed: that they live in God now and forever.

Prayer for our Veterans and Military Members

Father, bless our veterans and all who serve our nation defending our freedom.

For those who bravely gave their lives, grant them eternal rest.

For those who are serving, give them courage.

For those who served, we offer our gratitude.

We ask this through Christ Our Lord. Amen.





Holy Heroes for November-Saint John Paul II and Saint Faustina

Our seventh grade class, along with their teacher, Miss Hope Glidewell, lead our morning assemblies daily and teach our school about two Holy Heroes—Saint John Paul II and Saint Faustina. These two saints were canonized in the 21st century. On April 30, 2000, Pope John Paul II canonized Saint Faustina as 'the great Apostle of Divine Mercy' and the second Sunday of Easter was officially designated as the Sunday of the Divine Mercy. Then, on *Divine Mercy Sunday*, May 1, 2011, the beatification of Pope John Paul II was held at the Vatican in Rome. These 7th graders lead us as we pray this Divine Mercy Chaplet Opening Prayer daily, "You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us." This week we learned about St. John Paul's perseverance and leadership.

Sunday November 15, 11:00-1:00 p.m.





Almost 500 families participate in the tuition support through the Grawe Fund. This academic year \$319,635 was given to support tuition costs with an average of \$703 to each family.

There is now a new option for supporting the schools that EVERYONE can help make a difference to our schools. When purchasing gift cards, and you do not have a student to designate the funds to, you can name one of the Catholic Schools and a check will be given to the school at the end of the year. So now you can purchase gift cards & designate St. Anthony's/St. Dominic's for all of your purchases.

Purchasing these cards costs you nothing and goes a long way toward helping cover the costs of a Catholic education. The merchants discount the cards – you pay the face value! The fund receives from 2% to 20% from the vendors for us to sell their cards. It is a win-win for all. How wonderful a program!

We would like to be able to continue to support the students and how much more that support will mean this coming school year.
