# November 15, 2020 -Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

A Message from Father Tom Donovan



The Thirty-third Week of Ordinary Time asks us to consider "investments". Certainly we all understand how important it is to save for retirement, or to put back funds for our kids' college educations, or to save for a major purchase, such as a home or a car. Financial advisors

remind us how we must balance the blend of risk and reward in our investments. For things we cannot lose, like a retirement 'nest egg', which can take may years to build up, normally the advice is to assume a very conservative approach. On the other hand, business owners and entrepreneurs know that often it is necessary to take a fair amount of risk in order that the business might expand and be successful.


Jesus understands this trade-off, I think, as he presents his parable. The servants were given 'talents'—units of money—which they were to invest and from that investment, provide their master a financial gain. Two of the servants did just that, making a return on the investment, and the master praised their work and gave them greater responsibility. Another servant hid the money though, hoping not to incur the wrath of the master if the money were lost. He was condemned by the master. The moral of the story appears to be that while the fear of loss is rightfully severe, even more frightening should be the failure to invest what little we have, which has been given by the master in the first place, so that the master may have a return on his money. Of course, this story is not a tale about the adventures of money-changers... it is a parable about managing our fear and accepting even personal risk to promote the growth of the Kingdom of God.

There are many Christians who, giving up on becoming 'saints' in the truest sense of the word, simply want to make sure that they "made it". They have not committed serious sin, they have stayed away from a dissolute life, they are good spouses and parents and workers in the community. As their life's work goes before them, it seems unnecessary (and perhaps foolish) to make extraordinary risks which might put eternal salvation in jeopardy. Holding a conservative, defensive faith is actually not a bad position to take if we really do consider our salvation the most important thing in our lives.

But, I think Jesus wants to challenge us to think bigger than ourselves and our own salvation, and to consider if there is something that we can risk for him and his Kingdom. What has the Christian faith called you to risk? How have you been invited ot invest your time and talents and treasure into the Kingdom of God? I wonder sometimes about the courage and zeal of those who have given up their homes and even their lives ot be missionaries at the very edge of the civilized world. That would take an amazing amount of faith to bear that kind of risk well. But consider the reward! Not everyone is called to be a missionary, but there are so many other smaller ways to 'take a risk' in the work of promoting evangelization. IT is ultimately not just for our own good, but for the salvation of souls that we proclaim Christ, who is not only the focal point of our worship, but the harvest-master who justly receives the fruits of our labors.

Purchasing these cards costs you nothing and goes a long way toward helping cover the costs of a Catholic education. The merchants discount the cards – you pay the face value! The fund receives from 2% to 20% from the vendors for us to sell their cards. It is a win-win for all. How wonderful a program!
