A Message from Father Tom Donovan



Christ the Universal King: Today's solemnity reminds us that greatness isn't found in the glory of this world, but by the moral perfection that comes from caring for others before oneself. Sitting on his throne the king will look to those on his right and say, "Come, you who are blessed by my father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for

me, in prison and you visited me." (Matthew 25: 34-36) To those who empty themselves for others, nothing less than the kingdom of heaven is your inheritance!



Important announcement regarding Christmas Masses for 2020: In light of the ongoing COVID crisis, we have been carefully considering how to accommodate our parishioners for Christmas Mass. As you know, we can easily have more than 1,000 people at Church in the 24 hours of Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, which makes planning very difficult in an age of social distancing and providing for the safest possible environment for our parishioners, families, and guests. In order to accommodate the most people we

can, as safely as we can, here is what we are going to do:

Christmas Eve, 4pm. Mass at St. Anthony. We are asking our regular parishioners to PLEASE not come to this Mass. This Mass appears to have the most 'casual guests' who are not normally with us through the rest of the year. Thus, they do not read the bulletin or necessarily pay attention to schedules, but simply come each year at this time out of habit. We want to be able to welcome and accommodate these guests as best we can at this hour. Again, we are asking our regular parishioners NOT to come to this Mass, so that out seating will be maximal for guests. There will be no special children's program at this Mass, as has been our tradition in the past. When the Church (and parish hall basement) is full, we will likely have to turn people away or redirect them to an alternate Mass, perhaps at St. Dominic's or another church in town.

Christmas Eve 6:00pm and 8:00pm, Mass at St. Anthony. Note these new times for 2020. These Masses will be by reservation only and will not be advertised or published publicly so that those who have reservations will be able to be assured of their places. We ask our regular parishioners who wish to attend these Masses to sign up with the most reasonable number they can give us (please do not reserve any more than you need). Signups will be available in person in the church vestibule starting at NOON on Saturday, November 28. When these Masses are full, further signups will be declined. If both Masses fill up, we will either add a 10pm Mass at St. Anthony's or an additional Mass at St. Dominic's during this evening.

Christmas Day: Midnight and 9:00 am. We will also ask for reservations for these Masses. If they fill up, we will add an additional Mass on either Christmas Day or Christmas Evening. As long as these Masses do not fill up, we will advertise them as having 'open seating' available.

Right now I am going to be a bit vague about the possibility of using St. Dominic's as an additional or overflow site. The decision to open St. Dominic's and publish Mass times for there will be based on the availability of a priest for a celebration there, as well as the demand we experience in signups, so please sign up sooner, rather than later, so that the parish staff can make good decisions on how to deploy our resources at this 'high demand' time for celebrating the Nativity of our Lord.

We will make our best effort to broadcast Mass from St. Anthony Church over YouTube and Facebook on our regular channels.

# A Message from Mrs. Carol Frericks—Principal

#### St. Dominic School Begins Remote Learning This Week

Every week St. Dominic School Families receive a Monday Morning Message and a Friday Parent Newsletter to keep them engaged and informed about the students' experiences at school. We have also provided updates on COVID cases at our school. For the past two weeks, we have shared the message that "if we find out that we have more active cases this week, we will probably need to transition into remote learning. Please be prepared to transition to remote learning at home in case we need to make that transition." On Wednesday, November 18th our school began the transition to temporary remote learning with a preparation day for the staff so school was not in session. On Thursday, we began remote learning while the teachers taught online from their laptops and Smart Boards in their classrooms and the students engaged from home using their devices and books. Currently, we have 7 active COVID cases. To date, we have had 8 students and 7 staff members with positive results since the beginning of school. With several teachers in quarantine and substitute teachers are limited, we needed to transition to remote learning until Monday, December 7th. We are so thankful for our substitutes who have helped us through these last few weeks when teachers were quarantined.

<u>The Gene Grawe Fund</u> would like to remind everyone to think about purchasing gift cards to support our Catholic Schools and students. Almost 500 families participate in the tuition support through the Grawe Fund. This academic year \$319,635 was given to support tuition costs with an average of \$703 to each family.

There is now a new option for supporting the schools that EVERYONE can help make a difference to our schools. When purchasing gift cards, and you do not have a student to designate the funds to, you can name one of the Catholic Schools and a check will be given to the school at the end of the year. So now you can purchase gift cards & designate St. Anthony's/St. Dominic's for all of your purchases.

Purchasing these cards costs you nothing and goes a long way toward helping cover the costs of a Catholic education. The merchants discount the cards – you pay the face value! The fund receives from 2% to 20% from the vendors for us to sell their cards. It is a win-win for all. How wonderful a program!
