### December 13, 2020—Third Sunday of Advent (B)

#### A Message from Father Tom Donovan



The "rose" weekends of Advent and Lent, I think, serve as 'reality checks' for the preparation seasons before Christmas and Easter. In Lent, the Fourth Sunday in Rose, "Laetare Sunday," falls at just past the half-way point to encourage the faithful to keep up with their fasting and penance and prayer, perhaps started with zeal on Ash Wednesday, but flagging after several weeks. It serves as an encouragement to re-invigorate those resolutions which have fallen by the wayside, so that

one can complete Lent well. The Advent season is much shorter, and its penitential character is somewhat different, but this Third Week of Advent is a milestone in our preparations. Christmas will be here in just two weeks. Have he heard the voice of the prophets and taken comfort in our God who loves us and desires to save us? Are we even more hungry for the gifts of salvation given at Christmas? Has the example of the Blessed Virgin inspired us to being ever-more perfect in our "yes" to God? Are we ready for Christmas, both in history and at the end of time?

I look at these Rose weekends not as simply 'marking time', though. Rose is a sign that even as we wait, the Lord is here among us now. Even as we wait, the Kingdom is here in our midst. Even as we struggle to find unity and reconciliation with God and neighbor, the Holy Spirit is given to make us holy. The red of Advent Rose is not the flashy-red of Pentecost. It is not the zealous red of martyr's blood. It is not the bloody red of victim and sacrifice. It is a modest, humble red... a softer red... a nuanced red. The Holy Spirit lurks behind the season in subtle, almost inaudible, invisible ways. The Holy Spirit is veiled in the mystery of a Virgin who bore a child, the Eternal Word of God, while hidden in a stable. The Holy Spirit labors quietly to bring to perfection and satisfaction those who cry out from their own 'poverty of spirit' and need for God. The Third Sunday of Advent is, if you will, a 'small Pentecost' right in the middle of Advent, but without the all drama. God draws near his people through the seemingly-mundane events of everyday life. So we wear the rose vestments and light the rose candles displaying the more restrained hues of red to honor God's simplicity and humility. We proclaim "Rejoice in the Lord always, again I say rejoice!" It is a small Pentecost to reveal the Lord presently in our midst, even as we long for his final coming.

Joyfully receive this outpouring of the Spirit at this unexpected time in our preparations! Embrace the Word, laboring to be revealed in his Holy People through the power and invitation of the Spirit. In this we prepare well for the coming of our Lord at Christmas.




### A Message from Mrs. Carol Frericks—Principal




