A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan: 2020 Year in Review

The Christmas-season bulletins are always due early, which makes finding timely content sometimes difficult, so this week, I present a 2020 "Top 10" year-in-review article! Blessed Christmas! -Fr. Tom Donovan

On January 1, little did any of us know that the year 2020 would be defined by the SARS-CoV-2 novel coronavirus, identified in 2019 in Wuhan, China, which became the international story of 2020. We spent 13 weeks in spring and early summer on a stay-at-home order by the State of Illinois and accompanied with a dispensation from Bishop Pap-



rocki from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. After the initial shut-down, occupancy and space restrictions limiting the number of people who could gather in our church or school at any one time were imposed. Those who consider themselves elderly or vulnerable to the effects of the disease were urged to avoid groups and large gathering. By the end of 2020, the Ad-

ams County Health Department had tracked nearly 6,000 cases of COVID-19, with a death rate near about 1% of those cases. Fr. Tom frequently prayed the protection of Christ, the Divine Mercy upon the parish, encouraging the display of the Divine Mercy image in parishioner homes.

...but "the show must go on."
Despite the restrictions and the challenges of the year, the parish has shown remarkable resiliency in maintaining its operations and its ministries. One of the first responses to the crisis



was to run Internet over to the church and assemble a makeshift webcasting rig to

provide daily Mass and Holy Hours through the most restrictive period of the shut-down, including Holy Week.

Mastering the Art of the Drive-Thru: the health crisis did not stop all of the gatherings and traditions of the parish. The Pancake Breakfast, Chicken Dinner and a special Turkey Dinner was transformed from a social gathering to a



take-home extravaganza where each lined up cars along the south drive of the parish and sometimes even up St. Anthony Road until all were sold out.

Mastering the Art of Remote Learining: When the stay-at-home order came down, the staff and families of St. Dominic School were able to transform learning as we know it, using Google Classroom to continue learning for the rest of the 2019-20 school year.



Thankfully we were able to return to school for the beginning of the 2020-21 school year.

Fr. Pawel Lucak: Our seminarian was ordained a priest on May 3 by Bishop Paprocki at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception. The event was webcast throughout the diocese and only 10 people were in attendance because of




the occupancy restrictions. Fr. Pawel received his first priestly assignment as Parochial Vicar at the Church of St. Peter in Quincy, and so he remains a neighbor to us.

Mastering the Art of Graduation: Eighth grade graduation was celebrated in special 2020-style. After webcast Mass held at St. Anthony Church, a caravan of cars lead

by our Principal, Mrs. Carol Frericks and Eighth Grade teacher, Mrs. Donna Richmiller paraded across the countryside and through town for nearly 2 hours to present graduates with their diploma at their homes with their families. At each stop, the graduates were hailed with a blare of car horns and music from the festive caravan before moving on to their next stop.

We welcomed Pat Holbrook in the parish office and Nancy Boone in the school office this year. Nancy is no stranger to St. Anthony's having previously served as secretary to St. Anthony Church and St. Anthony School before helping at St. Peter's for the last 15 years. We congratulate Nancy on the recent birth of her grandson, Boone. Pat Holbrook comes to us after most recently serving at the chaplaincy office at Blessing Hospital. Her husband, Dennis, is our dea-We are blessed to con candidate, have a great office staff both for the



parish and the school. Please join me in thanking them all for their above-and-beyond efforts this year!

The Restored Order of the Sacraments brought our inaugural Third Grade Confirmation-and-First-Communion Class, along with the confirmation of our Seventh and Eight Grade classes at St. Dominic School and St. Anthony PSR. Bishop Paprocki decreed the normative age for Confirmation to be at about Third Grade following the recent Diocesan Synod, reasoning that our young people now need the graces of the sacraments sooner in their young lives to help them grow in the spirit of Christian Stewardship flowing from their baptisms. Again, 2020 required special accommodations for these celebrations, with Fr. Tom receiving delegation to confirm more than 70 candidates across four different celebrations.
