A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Wednesday of this coming week is Ash Wednesday, which is the beginning of Lent. Lent exists for the purpose of preparing the Church for Easter Sunday, the annual celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ. It is time to take account of our lives, to recognize our need for a savior, to repent from our sins, to find forgiveness, and to look forward to the Lord's coming in glory with greater hope and expectation.

This year, in addition to offering Mass on Wednesday evenings at 6:00 pm, (except for 6:30 on Ash Wednesday,) we will resume daily Holy Hours at the Church, similar to what we did last spring during the height of the COVID shutdown. Holy Hour will be held at 5:00 pm M-F and conclude with Benediction at about 5:45-5:50 each evening, and may include a public rosary, Evening Prayer, and on Fridays, the Stations of the Cross. We do not plan at this time to webcast the holy hour, but rather invite the faithful to come to church for a time of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament.

On Ash Wednesday, Masses will be at 7:30am and 6:30pm at St. Anthony Church. There will be a 9:00am Mass at St. Dominic School. As a concession to the pandemic, we have been advised by the Congregation for Divine Worship in Rome that distribution of Ashes will be modified modestly to include the silent sprinkling of ashes over the heads of those receiving this sign of penitence. We advise all not to wear head coverings and for those who are concerned about 'permanents', wigs, weaves, or special hair-washing or styling requirements to consider deferring from this traditional practice.

Lenten Regulations: Lent begins this year on **Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021** and will end just prior to the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, **April 1, 2021**, when the Paschal Triduum begins. Lent is the principal penitential season in the Church year. All Christian Faithful are urged to develop and maintain a program of self-denial, prayer, and the performance of deeds of charity and mercy (including giving of alms), *in addition to* the following *minimal* Lenten disciplines:

- ABSTINENCE Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- While abstinence is not required under the age of 14, it is laudable that parents teach children abstinence and other suitable acts penance as a way to learn and understand the true spirit of the Lenten season.
- FAST Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.
- Over age 59, it is laudable to follow the discipline of fasting on these days, but one should not scruple about modifying or breaking the fast at this age when matters of health and well-being come into question.
- Under age 59, when pregnant or nursing, performing significant manual labor, or suffering from a serious illness (a chronic illness such as diabetes or hypoglycemia, or a more immediate illness where fasting would not be healthy,) it may be morally impossible to follow this precept.
- To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

"Seriously sinful" is a moral theologian's code word for "mortal sin," given a person acting with knowledge, freedom, and choice. 'Accidents' are not necessarily mortal sins, but may perhaps be a sign that one is not taking one's Lenten disciplines seriously enough, which may be a separate issue for one's conscience.
