A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

Thanks to all who have been participating in our Friday Fish Fries. One of the major benefactors of these fish fries is our Men's Society. I wanted to take a moment to acknowledge all of the hard work that our Men do in order to maintain our grounds and facilities.

In particular, in the last month, we had both of our furnaces go out in the Parish Hall at St. Anthony. The south furnace was replaced and the north furnace re-



quired a new logic board, with the total costs of these projects running just under \$5,000. Two weeks ago, you may have noticed the earth-moving equipment at St. Anthony's digging around in sub-freezing weather to track a couple of underground water leaks. One of the leaks was found around the hydrant in the lawn of the rectory and another between the water meter and the Parish Hall is still elusive and will be tracked when the weather clears a bit. In the meantime, the leak was secured and a secondary line from the church was run to provide water for the Parish Hall. This last week, our Men came out to school where a fan on the boiler broke, shutting down the boiler until it could get replaced. (I don't have a price on that project yet.)

During the Christmas break, we undertook a project for asbestos abatement around the HVAC units in the school gym, which cost about \$13,000. Earlier in January a blower for the school heating system was replaced for several thousand dollars. Finally, the Men are taking primary financial responsibility through their fundraising work of the last year or so, to pay for the replacement of two air conditioning units on gym at school, costing approximately \$31,000. When you sit in the warm church this winter and the cool gym at Junefest later on this summer, when you flush a toilet or notice that a kneeler has been fixed, a word of thanks is in order to our Men's Society and in particular the gentlemen that come out, rain or shine to keep the physical plants at our church and school running! They appreciate your help when they come asking for donations or your support at fish fries, the pancake and sausage breakfast, and the other events they sponsor throughout the year!



Each weeknight (M-F) at 5pm, we are offering a Eucharistic Holy Hour at St. Anthony Church during Lent. On Fridays, this time includes the Stations of the Cross, and otherwise the hour has been reserved for silent prayer. We would be happy to have the rosary recited on occasion during these hours, and are welcoming volunteers who would like to lead. Please call the parish office at (217) 222-5996 to offer your help! Every year on the Second Sunday of Lent, the Church reads an account of the Transfiguration. Jesus took Peter, James, and John up a mountain and presented them a vision of his glory—a glory not otherwise seen by human eyes on this side of his passion and death. The disciples were amazed at this vision and desired to stay in the presence of the sight even 'pitching tents' which conveys not only the language of resting in the moment, but using this as a base-camp in order to welcome others to come up and see (perhaps with a price for admission!) The Lord chose not to allow this, but to instead urge the disciples down the mountain and abck into 'real life'. In doing so, he taught them that the passion and death he was to suffer was a necessary part of the path to his glory.

As we continue our Easter preparations, we are urged not to skip forward or to take shortcuts. We must fully surrender ourselves to the Lord in order to appreciate the Glory of the Resurrection. Remaining disci-


plined to the practices of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving, and remaining disciplined in the habits of denying oneself and carrying the cross will, only in due time, result in the glorious changes of habit and attitude we are working toward at Easter. If you haven't really started in your Lenten practes, now is the time to begin! If you have started and already been seriously tempted... or outright failed... now is the time to try again! The journey has only begun and there are still almost five full weeks to receive the great gifts from God as part of our Lenten journey.
