March 14, 2021 — Fourth Sunday of Lent

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Rejoice Jerusalem: and come together all who love her. Rejoice with joy, you that have been in sorrow, that you may exult and be Jerúsa-lem: filled with consolation!

The Fourth Sunday of Lent, "Laetare Sunday" lies just beyond the half-way point of the forty days of Lent. It is not merely a marker of time, but this Sunday is also meant to be a day of encouragement, for the celebration of Easter draws near! Even while we intensify our fasting, prayer, and almsgiving, more perfectly denying ourselves in imitation of the suffering Christ, the glory of the resurrection shines through us!

Today we hear a reading from the Second Book of Chronicles. This is perhaps one of the saddest days in the history of God's people, when they were swallowed up in darkness and despair. The temple had been burned and looted. Those who survived the sword were taken to Babylon in chains. The prophets announced a curse over the nation until the people had "made up their lost Sabbaths" and returned to worship of the one, true God, forsaking their worldliness. Seventy years would pass, dooming this generation nd the next to a time of purification through trials and tribulations.



Coupled with this heartbreaking story, the Church also gives us the famous passage from the Gospel of John: For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish, but might have eternal life. For God did not send his son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved in him.

Lent is a time for penance but also a time for a kind of rejoicing. Sin has exiled us from our natural state of happiness and holiness, but our exile need not be eternal. Our God aches to draw us to himself, out of the darkness of our own doing and back into his marvelous light. We may undergo our own times of tribulation and

exile, but hope comes through the Blood of the Cross and the Joy of the Resurrection. Such power in the words of John 3:16! it is the 'mission statement' of our savior!

Redemption takes place, not simply as a 'me and God' proposition, but it takes place in the community of Jerusalem... in that place of right-worship, set aside from all the hills of the world, from all the places where false worship takes place. Jerusalem is the sign and the foretelling of the Church. The Church is that community which worships God-Almighty himself, forsaking all ofher gods. All nations stream towards her that they might know the goodness of God and his covenant with humanity. During Lent, we are called to renew our observance of that covenant, which is expressed not only in worship, but the way we live our lives every day apart from the sacred sanctuary.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available at its usual time between the 4:00 pm and 6:30 pm Masses on Saturday night. I will also hear confessions before the



4:00 pm Mass the next several weeks before Easter. Next Sunday March 21), the priests of the Quincy are a will gather at St. Francis Church at 2:00 pm to hear confessions until all are heard. The following Sunday (Palm Sunday March 28,) we will gather again at Blessed Sacrament Church (1119 South 7th Street) at 2:00 pm to hear confessions until all are heard. Sacramental confession should be considered an essential part of finishing Lent well... put it on your calendar!
