A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



An Announcement from Bishop Paprocki: On March 15, Bishop Paprocki released a decree and a letter announcing that he is withdrawing the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass for most of the faithful of the diocese due to the COVID-19 pandemic. "The time has come," he says, "as the COVID vaccine has been more widely administered and the number of cases has substantially diminished in recent weeks." The obligation to "keep holy the Sabbath" is a matter of divine law, which finds as its every-day interpretation in the ecclesial law as "going to Mass on Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation". Divine laws cannot be dispensed, however for the good of the faithful, the ecclesial law had been temporarily relaxed to accommodate the needs of the community during the time of COVID. Our faith is not a 'virtual faith', and while the video-cast Masses will continue for a while, for the good of the faithful who still need it, we urge all others to prepare themselves for the fruitful celebration of the Sacramental mysteries in person. The dispensation will be lifted on the weekend of April 11, with the celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday.

Aware that there are several classes of people who still need a degree of protection from this virus, Bishop Paprocki continues to allow those in the following categories to receive the benefit of the dispensation:

- Those 65 years of age or older;
- Those at risk of severe illness due of underlying medical conditions as described by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention;
- Those who care for the sick, the homebound, or the infirmed;
- Those women who are pregnant; and
- Those who cannot be accommodated at Mass because the church was at safedistancing capacity. ** Fr. Tom: This is likely going to be an issue in our church considering attendance in recent weeks. Upon a lengthy discussion with and strong consensus from parish staff and our pastoral council, it is my intention to continue to NOT to turn anyone away at the door who understands and accepts the risks to attend church and who choose to attend. I am asking our ushers to maintain spaces in the back of the church which remain more 'distanced' from each other, and I ask those who wear masks and desire greater spacing to sit towards the back. When it becomes necessary, I ask ushers to pull ropes closing pews in the front first It is also my intention to provide a 'safer space' experience by adding Masses as the weather begins to become more moderate, to accommodate those who expect and need it. For those who believe this is an untenable compromise, I invite you to make the most of the continuing dispensation until official proscriptions for attendance accommodate the numbers we need to host at weekend Masses. Be aware, also that Saturday night Mass at 6:30 tends to be the lightest attendance and the widest distribution of people in our church. I also would be happy to accommodate individuals who would like to commute their obligation to a weekday, on a case-by-case basis

In addition, the bishop reminds us that the following people are obligated NOT to attend Mass in order to protect the health and the safety of others who are at church:

- Those who are currently ill;
- Those who have a fever or exhibit flu-like symptoms;
- Those who have a good reason to believe they might be asymptomatic of a contagious illness (e.g., those who were in recent contact with someone who has testes positive for a disease such as COVID or influenza).

The bishop also provides for those who have significant fears or anxieties about becoming ill by returning to Mass, who otherwise do not fit into the above categories, for instance, those who have not received the COVID vaccine. Bishop has extended to me, as the pastor, the ability to dispense in individual cases, which I intend to do on a month-at-a-time basis after meeting or talking privately with those who are affected.

We are in the home-stretch of this thing, I think. Please be considerate of each other, especially as the space in the church may be at a premium. Indeed, while precautions are being taken, we continue to explain that we cannot guarantee the safety of all who choose to come to Mass. We will do our best to accommodate both the rightful desire to return to as normal a life as usual, while also protecting others. I beg our parishioners for understanding for those who want to be perhaps more cautious than you are. I will do what I can in coming weeks to expand our Mass schedule as spreading out on the front lawn becomes an option again
