## A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Congratulations to our Confirmandi and our First Communicants who are to receive these Easter Sacraments this weekend at special noon and 6pm Masses this Sunday. It is a particular privilege for me as pastor to exercise faculties granted by Bishop Paprocki to celebrate Confirmation with our young people. They have had a special place in my prayer over the last several weeks as I have been reflecting on the mystery of the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the faithful. It is the power of the Holy Spirit, sent by the Father and the Son as the Third Person of the Divine Trinity whocomes to dwell in the faithful for the purposes of increasing

faith, affirming one's witness to the work of God in their lives, helping them to grow in holiness, and configuring them more perfectly into the family of God's sons and daughters. This is no timid Spirit. This is a Spirit which communicates the will of God and his inspirations into every bit of our lives. We are, after all, Temples of the Holy Spirit, as St. Paul explains. The Spirit dwells in his faithful, and His gifts are perfected in this special sacrament which is a blessing not only on the young people receiving it, but upon our entire parish family. Congratulations to nearly 60 young people who present themselves before God this weekend to accept the gift of the Holy Spirit in their lives.



Thank you to those who have contributed to a scholarship in honor of our centarian, Father Irenaeus Kimminau, OFM. Thus far we have collected nearly \$4,000 which will be invested with the Quincy Catholic Elementary (QCES) Schools Foundation to provide scholarships for St. Anthony and St. Dominic students. We continue to receive donations for this fund through the parish office or through the QCES Foundation, c/o Paul Rittof our same mailing address, 2223 St. Anthony Road.

Father Ire sent a note of thanks to the parish last week for all of the kind wishes and observances for his 100th birthday. We wish him well on his goal of making 110 years in good health and God's grace!


Recently Bishop Paprocki reinstated the Sunday Mass obligation for most Catholics under 65 years old, otherwise in good health. At the same time, he rescinded the diocese-wide COVID mitigation policies, entrusting the judgment on this matter to local pastors. As you know, our local 7-day infection rates have been consistently under 2% since mid-February, and now the Adams County Health Department reports that 1/3 of Adams County residents are fully vaccinated with a vaccine which has proven to be both safe and effective. This is good news, but we are obviously still not out of the woods yet.

The most important mitigation steps we can take as a community is to stay home if you are showing symptoms consistent with COVID and be careful about washing/sanitizing our hands. As you probably remember, I had some COVID-like symptoms about two weeks ago and took the weekend off to get tested. The PA who was serving me was adamant that the science says that there was no good reason to be tested for COVID at this point, because I have been fully immunized and had a mild case last November. She relented when I told her that my purposes were for the protection of the larger body of people that I serve all week long, to which she agreed that testing would not be ruled out. It turns out that my tests were, as expected, negative for COVID, but positive for a minor rhinovirus, and consistent with allergies I have each year at this time—but it is better to know for sure than not!

We have hundreds of people who come to our church each weekend, representing a broad tapestry of medical conditions, risk tolerances, political opinions, and other factors. I have reminded everyone many times that we are unable to guarantee the safety of all who attend Mass with us, even with higher-protocol precautions such as absolute requirements for mask-wearing and social distancing. By my observation and that of my advisory councils, I have taken the approach of being a bit more permissive, with the greatest good being served by not denying anyone who accepts the risks to attend Mass with us. Recent conversations with personnel from the Diocese have affirmed that they have been in agreement with that approach... indeed, the leadership in Quincy and Adams County is being affirmed by the recognition that a 'one size fits all' approach was no longer suitable for the entire diocese.

#### A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan, continued:

This does not mean that things are 'over'. There has been a stubborn increase in cases over the last couple of months. We do need to continue to be careful, and especially to be sensitive to the sensibilities of those who are joining us for Mass. To that end: it is not considered polite to ask a person of their immunization status. That is private medical information which people have made a very personal decision with respect to deciding whether to take a medication which is not yet fully approved by the FDA. There are also nagging moral issues over these vaccines, which I think we need to give some 'safe space' to be expressed and heard. At the same time, I think there is room for those who have been vaccinated to share their experiences and encourage others to help attain a greater level of safety, if it is consistent with their health status.

In the same way, there are those who continue to wear face masks, which is consistent with advice from various health authorities. I suspect that this might be a permanent preference for some, and so be it. For the time being, in order to maintain greater peace of mind for those who are still shy about attending Mass, as a gesture of welcome and inclusion, that we accommodate those who wish to wear masks and practice greater separation, by reserving the pews on the south side of the church, which are still marked off every other pew, for those who wish to take greater precautions. If other pews in the church are filled, please ask permission before getting too close to a neighbor if you are sitting in that area. Everyone sitting in the south section should be ready to don a mask if a neighbor asks. Finally, those who are sitting in the south section have the responsibility of asking someone who sits there unknowingly, to please maintain space, if that is your purpose for sitting in that area.

We need to work together in these matters so that we can accommodate and welcome so many who wish to come to Mass again. It is not a perfect situation, but if we work together with the consideration of others first in our minds, there should be no reason for hurt feelings, the estrangement of those who feel excluded, or, in the end, any greater danger if we provide a bit more room for those who feel they need it. Please cooperate with your fellow parishioners and ushers as we continue to negotiate the challenges of the present times. Thank you!
