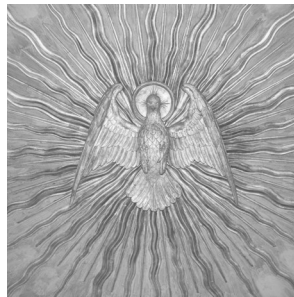
A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



It is my pleasure to take a break this week from writing the pastor's column to introduce Miss Hope Glidewell, our seventh grade teacher at St. Dominic's and our organist at 6:30pm Mass. She is pursuing a Master's degree in Theological Studies (MTS) from Franciscan University in Steubenville (OH), and one of her final class projects was to write a Sunday bulletin article for Pentecost, which I am happy to publish here!

Happy Pentecost Sunday. May the Blessings of Easter 2021 echo unto eternal life in all who have celebrated with faith and devotion!

A Message from Hope Glidewell:



We have had such a spirit-filled celebration in our parish these last fifty days of Easter! We started the season by bringing in two new members to full communion with the Church. Two weeks ago, we had such a beautiful celebration of Confirmation for our 3rd, 5th, 6th, and 7th graders. With the lifting of the dispensation, we are also once again gathering together for the Lord's Supper with a renewed reverence and sense of awe. It is only fitting that we celebrate the end of Eastertide with the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. You may find yourself asking the same two questions I am: What should I do with the great gifts the Spirit has given me this Easter? And how should I do it?

The answer to both questions can be answered by modeling ourselves after the apostles and our own young people here at St. Anthony's parish. As we heard throughout the Easter season, the apostles took seriously the great commission to make disciples of all people, as we heard in the Gospel of Mark just last week at the Ascension. You might think that we as lay people cannot follow the apostles' example; after all, we were not there when Christ walked the Earth, and we are not ordained successors to the apostles. However, we have experienced the work of the Spirit in our lives. We were there when we were baptized, we are there experiencing God's love for us every week when we participate in the Eucharist, and if we listen and watch well enough, we witness the work of the Holy Spirit in our everyday lives. Therefore, brothers and sisters, that great commission belongs to us all, just as much as it belonged to the apostles and now belongs to their ordained successors. As stated in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (CCC), the role of the laity is to, "be witnesses to Christ in all circumstances and at the very heart of the community of mankind (CCC 942)." Just as the apostles witnessed their experience of Christ's love, you and I are called to be witnesses to Christ's love in our own lives.

Our young people over at St. Dominic School are fantastic examples of living members of Christ's body and witnesses to His love. For two years now, we have been studying the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit. We have trained our hearts to recognize the work of the Spirit in our lives. Now we find ourselves in the same position as the apostles. We recognize have been gifted with the Spirit, now it is time to go out and make disciples. This coming school year, our theme will be Matthew's version of the Great Commission, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and behold, I am with you always, to the close of the age (Matthew 28:19-20)." Now that our students can recognize and name the Spirit, they will model themselves after the apostles and take that even further into our classrooms and out into the world.

Before returning to your regularly scheduled bulletin author, I want to leave you with one final challenge from the Gospel of Matthew, "You received without pay, give without pay (Matthew 10:8)." We are not meant to receive the gift of the Holy Spirit and hoard it as a private treasure, we are meant to receive the Holy Spirit and share it with others. I would like to invite each and every one of you to join our school in our mission this year. Pray about how you too can be attuned to the Spirit's work in your life. Then, pray about how to put it into action. Is there someone missing from our pews? Try reaching out to them to share your experience of the God's love through the Holy Spirit. If you cannot do that, pray and offer penances so that their hearts may become open and attuned to the call of the Spirit. I pray that our efforts are fruitful and that they may bring ever more disciples to the heart of our Lord.

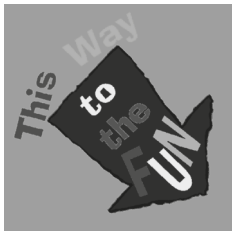

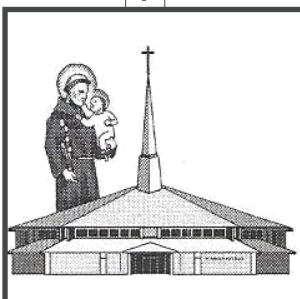
