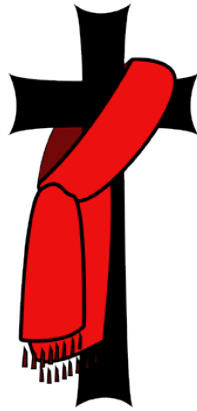

June 20, 2021 — Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Next weekend is the celebration of the ordination of our deacon candidate, Dennis Holbrook. This is the culmination of nearly six years of preparation and formation, and the beginning of a ministry at the heart of the Church which will touch the lives and inspire the faith of many as he lives the diaconal ministry. I am so grateful for the ministry of deacons in our Church, and include in my prayer for vocations, the calling and recognition of diaconal vocations in our midst, along with priestly and religious vocations. The ordination ceremony will take place at 10am on Saturday at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Springfield. I expect that as of the weekend, we should have some seats on the bus which will take people there and back (although we are going to open the bus to parishioners from St. Francis come Tuesday). Please consider joining us for this celebration. There will be a celebration in the parish on Sunday, June 27 at the 10:30am Mass, where Deacon Holbrook will be with us, along with family and friends, to preach and finally exercise the ministry among us. We thank him for his diligence and dedication to his formation while with us at St. Anthony's and we wish him well on his assignment at St. Francis Solanus Church, which begins on July 1, 2021.

It is sometimes surprising to hear from life-long Catholics that they have never seen or experienced an ordination. What happens at an ordination? It originates from the witness of the Acts of the Apostles, Chapter 6. In the modern experience, it looks a lot like Sunday Mass. The Church gathers at the appointed hour, with the bishop celebrating along with his college of priests and deacons and visiting clergy, which usually includes family and friends of the candidates as well as those involved in the candidates' formation. After the entrance rites, the readings, and the Gospel, the Cathedral falls silent as one of the deacons announce, "Let those to be ordained please stand." Each candidate's name is read, to which the candidate responds "present". After all are gathered in before of the bishop, one of the clergy involved in the candidates' formation petitions the bishop, "Holy Mother Church asks you to ordain these men to the responsibility of the Diaconate." The bishop asks if the candidates are worthy, to which an affirmation is announced. The bishop proclaims the candidates "Elect" to the ministry of deacons and the people of God respond with "Thanks be to God" and applause.

After a homily, the candidates gather again before the bishop and the candidates are examined. For the Diaconate, six promises are made. First, the candidates are asked if they agree to accept consecration to the ministry of the diaconate. The candidates are asked if they agree to assist the priestly order for the benefit of the People of God. The candidates are asked if they resolve "to hold fast to the mystery of faith" and proclaim the Gospel with a clear conscience. For those deacons who are transitioning to priesthood, the candidates are asked if they embrace celibacy as a sign of their dedication to Christ, as a sign of the coming of the Kingdom, and in service to God and the Church. "Permanent" deacons who are married are, of course, excluded from this promise. Finally, the candidates are asked if they resolve to confirm their lives to the example of Christ, whose Body and Blood they minister. Then, kneeling before the bishop, each candidate promises respect and obedience to the bishop and his successors.

Having completed the examination and having made these promises, one of the most iconic moments of the celebration ensues, where each of the candidates lay prostrate on the floor as the Church sings a Litany of Saints, calling down the prayers of all of God's holy ones upon these men about to be ordained. Then the moment comes: there are two essential parts to the ordination rite. First, the bishop lays hands on each of the candidates, the ancient sign of handing on a ministry. Next the bishop prays the prayer of consecration over the candidates:

...Lord, look with favor on these servants of yours, whom we now dedicate to the office of deacon, to minister at your holy altar. Send forth upon them the Holy Spirit, that they may be strengthened by the gift of your sevenfold grace to carry out faithfully the work on the ministry. May they excel in every virtue: love that is sincere, in concern for the sick and the poor, in assuming authority, in self discipline and holiness of life...

After the prayer, the candidates are dressed as deacons, in the stole draped across the chest as deacons wear and with the dalmatic, the ancient sleeved vestment distinguishable from the priests' chasuble. Then each approach the bishop one by one to receive the Book of the Gospels, to which the bishop exhorts them: "Receive the Gospel of Christ, whose herald you now are. Believe what you read, teach what you believe, and practice what you teach." The new deacons then receive the Kiss of Peace from the bishop and other deacons present, and they are seated among the deacons for the rest of the Mass. Some of the newly ordained deacons serve at the altar for the first time with the bishop. The Mass continues, sealing the ordination in the covenant of Christ's sacrifice, and as the celebration ends, the newly ordained and the bishop emerge from the Church to the applause and congratulations of a grateful world. Then the hard work of ministry and praying for the perseverance of the newly-ordained deacon in that ministry begin.

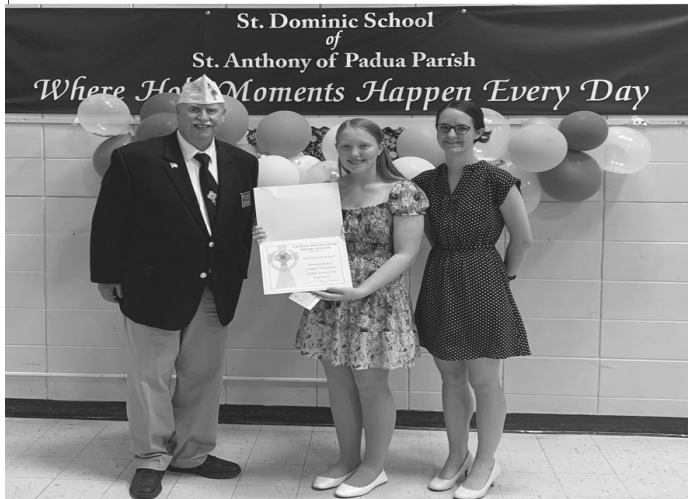

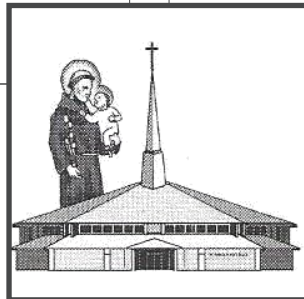
