# July 4, 2021 — Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

# A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:




July 4, 2021 marks the 245th year of the founding of the United States, as reckoned by the famous Declaration of Independence, which declares the grievances of the colonists before King George III and ultimately demands the remedy of establishing a separate, sovereign state. The writers of the Declaration recognized that their quest for Independence flows from their dignity as human perosns, "endowed by their creator with certain

inalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness." Governments are thus established to protect these rights, and by this objective, they derive their just powers from those governed until they become destructive towards these ends.

The writers of the Declaration and the founders of our union were largely deistic humanists, that is, people who believed in a god who created all that is, and is recognized as benevolent and powerful. But this deity stays distant from his people, giving humans the agency to do good and meritorious acts, through natural virtue. Part of this sensibility flows from the Protestant Revolution which had been raging in Europe for several hundred years by time of the American Revolution, coupled with a certain amount of agnostic humanism which was becoming popular in 'liberated' peoples who equated "the Church" with part of the system of oppression of people through political and social power.

Nonetheless, a prominent Catholic family, represented by Charles Carroll (1737-1832) of the

"Baltimore Carrolls" would endorse the document, pledging his Life, his Fortune, and his Sacred Honor to the endeavor to establish this new nation. Charles was a cousin of John Carroll, who would become the first bishop, and then Archbishop of Baltimore. The Carrols had immigrated from Ireland in the 18th century and were wealthy plantation owners (who opposed slavery) in the state of Maryland. After the War for Independence, Charles would later serve in the state government of Maryland, and briefly as a Senator in the federal government.

As Catholics, we have not only a rich heritage in our own faith, but also as citizens of a nation whose founding principles comes not from royal prerogative or even popular demand, but instead, as we read, come from divine favor towards those who recognize and embrace the dignity of the human person. While the anthropology (understanding of the human person) of deists and Christians differs in the understandings of the origins human merit and the destiny of human salvation, it is the cooperation of people of goodwill that has made our nation strong over its history, and which remains the source of our strength and destiny as a nation today.

On this Fourth of July, I ask you to pray for our nation... for the healing of our political system, for the deliverance of those who feel oppressed by injustices which linger in our society, for those who serve our nation as part of our military and other protection services for our citizens, working and sacrificing for peace and safety in our streets. Please pray for justice in our courts and wisdom in the halls of legislature. Pray for those who would aspire to take leadership roles within our government, that they may act in truth and justice, in the best ideals of our founding. Pray for God's blessing upon a land which is rich and bountiful, and all those who contribute to society by their labor, their artistic expression, and their patriotism. May God Bless America and deliver her from those who would wish her harm on this Independence Day.

#### MASS INTENTIONS for 2022

We will be opening our Mass Intention Book beginning July 6th. The following is a reminder of the guidelines for mass intentions from Father Tom's bulletin article last year.

"Finally, in order that all might have access to having Masses celebrated for their loved ones, we typically

ask that a name appear no more than once a month at a weekend Mass. Indeed, in order to spread out the intentions across the various Masses celebrated all week long, we are going to ask that if multiple intentions are presented, that they should be spread out with no more than 1/2 on weekends, and at least 1/2 on weekdays. We will do our best to satisfy requests for specific dates (anniversaries of birth, death, etc). But if a date is already chosen and we are requested to add a second intention to that day because of the personal importance of the day, we must have permission of both in order to set a day with a double intention. Finally, I am going to ask our secretaries to insure that particular intentions scheduled on Christmas, Easter, or other high-holy days occur no more than once every three years. I also intend to hold back one such intention to myself on each of these holidays in order to be able to offer it to those who are suffering a 'fresh' loss at the holidays. This is sometimes the gift that brings entire families back to Church and makes the holiday season just a little more bearable."
