# A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



This weekend, I am out of town to celebrate the 50th Wedding Anniversary of these handsome people... my parents. They were married in St. Patrick Church in Decatur, IL on July 10, 1971.

It is exciting to be able to celebrate Wedding Anniversaries in the parish, as each milestone marks years and years of living in God's grace. When I meet with a couple preparing for marriage, the first thing I relate to them is the Church's teaching about the properties of Christian Marriage. "Three F's, plus one": Marriage is Faithful, Fruitful, Final, and Free.

Christian Marriage is **faithful**... one enters with the intention of placing all of their energy, all of their intimacy, all of their hopes and dreams, all of their attention to this relationship above all (even the kids!). Marriages which fail because of breaches of faithfulness usually do not happen because a spouse finds themselves at the Roadside Inn at some point, but rather because that mutual intimacy and vulnerability of the couple tends to dull over time and inattention... inattention due to work, inattention due to children, inattention leading to loneliness, even in the midst of conjugal life. Prevent that kind of poverty in a relationship, and things will likely never get to physical infidelity. Christian Marriages are **fruitful**... not only because of the "fruits" which result from marital relations, but also in that the couple as a family and

unit of the Church are called to be generous, contributing members of the community. Marriages which are based out of selfishness or unilateral neediness of parties fail over time. Marriages which are distressed by the illness or loss of a child face particular challenges as well, and need to be nurtured by the mercy and faith of the Church. Christian Marriages are final. The consent given in vows on the day of one's wedding are not rescinded when things get tough. They are, indeed, for better or worse, richer or poorer, in sickness and in health. That consent is not withdrawn when one of the parties get sick, end up in jail, lose their fortune or their youthful looks. Loss is part of life, but the faithfulness called for in marriage is a reminder of the eternal... of God's enduring love through the joys and sufferings of life. The love of spouses is modeled after divine love. Finally, the vows of Christian Marriage are done in freedom. As spouses approach the altar, the do so, making a free gift of themselves to the other, holding nothing back, not being coerced by circumstances, making a free choice among all of the choices the world offers to make oneself a spouse to another. This is the particular reason why the Church very strenuously urges couples not to be living together before marriage. Besides the obvious scandal, (it is still called "living in sin",) and the temptation to sexual sin, having setup a household before making the commitment of marriage becomes an easy way for a couple to 'slouch their way' towards marriage by the path of least resistance, rather than to grow and adapt in anticipation of the gift of self that comes through the sacrament. Spouses who are already married, while committed to their relationship, can find great joy and enrichment by choosing each day to make their marriage the best it can be, freely renewing their commitment of sacrificial love to their spouse each day.

While we congratulate couples who celebrate decades of marriage and hope that all of our couples preparing for marriage at St. Anthony achieve a successful marriage, we know that there are intact marriages where spouses suffer tremendously. There are also marriages that end in divorce. Many Catholics are confused about their status in these situations. When a divorce has taken place, Catholics are not excommunicated. Yes, there may be sin, even mortal sin, that has lead to the breakup of a marriage that one should confess, but as long as a new attempt at marriage has not been made, then the divorced person is welcomed and urged(!) to continue to live the sacramental life of the Church. A subsequent attempt at marriage may be permitted if a person can demonstrate and the Church can determine that there was a defect in an attempt at marriage and a declaration of nullity may be obtained. This can be a complicated (but certainly not impossible) process that requires the advice and guidance of a pastor or another person trained to present cases to the marriage tribunal. Deacon and I are happy to discuss your situation and make sure that you find the help you need, if this is the case in your marriage.

I would like to encourage couples to consider taking the time to nurture their married relationships. We priests are constantly urged to take time for prayer and to go on retreats and days of recollection... do we do the same for those in the vocation of marriage? Not often enough. One of the tools we have is from the **FORMED** program which our parish subscribes to... check <a href="http://formed.org/signup">http://formed.org/signup</a> if you haven't done so yet, and look for the marriage program called "Beloved" (for couples before marriage) or "Beloved: Living Marriage" for married couples. Digital copies of the enrichment guide are available online, and if there is sufficient interest, we would be happy to order copies for those who would like to do the program on their own or with a group of other interested couples. Along with the other vocations we pray for on a daily basis, pray for those in the vocation of marriage, that they may be a sign of God's enduring love!

### MASS INTENTIONS for 2022

We will be opening our Mass Intention Book beginning July 6th. The following is a reminder of the guidelines for mass intentions from Father Tom's bulletin article last year.

"Finally, in order that all might have access to having Masses celebrated for their loved ones, we typically ask that a name appear no more than once a month at a weekend Mass. Indeed, in order to spread out the intentions across the various Masses celebrated all week long, we are going to ask that if multiple intentions are presented, that they should be spread out with no more than 1/2 on weekends, and at least 1/2 on weekdays. We will do our best to satisfy requests for specific dates (anniversaries of birth, death, etc). But if a date is already chosen and we are requested to add a second intention to that day because of the personal importance of the day, we must have permission of both in order to set a day with a double intention. Finally. I am going to ask our secretaries to insure that particular intentions scheduled on Christmas, Easter, or other high-holy days occur no more than once every three years. I also intend to hold back one such intention to myself on each of these holidays in order to be able to offer it to those who are suffering a 'fresh' loss at the holidays. This is sometimes the gift that brings entire families back to Church and makes the holiday season just a little more bearable."
