A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



It is **St. Anthony Picnic** Weekend once again. Welcome to all of our family, friends, neighbors, visitors, and benefactors. The Picnic is, first of all, an opportunity to celebrate our parish family. For more than a century our parishioners and our forebears have gathered here to fry chicken, drink cold beer, entertain the children with games, hear music, and renew friendships. It has, of course, also been one of our major fund-raisers through the years to help support the parish and its mission and

ministries. Our midsummer event has relied on the hard work of many who staff the stands, help with the setup and take-down, who donate to the country store, the raffles, and the other prize pools, and who maintain the grounds and the infrastructure (electric, kitchen equipment, mowing and landscaping, among many other activities) year-round that we can be ready for the Picnic when it rolls around. To them, and to all who come out for the Picnic, please accept my profound thanks!



"Setting the Table"... Our reading of the sixth chapter of the Gospel of Mark ends this weekend, preparing for the next six weeks' readings from the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John, where Jesus proclaims, "I am the Bread of Life." (John 6:35) In the next verses of Mark 6, we were to hear the story of the feeding of the 5,000, but the Gospel of John tells the story and then pauses to meditate on the meaning of that miraculous day at some length. The Church invites into that meditation by presenting the sixth chapter of John over six weeks, allowing us to see ourselves as the hungry, lost sheep from today's Gos-

pel. "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest with me for a while." (Mark 6: 31) Everyone reading this bulletin should have a bible at home; I invite you to reread the sixth chapter of John during the coming week. The Lord has an important message for us all, if we slow down and come away with him for a little while.



A couple of weeks ago on the school page, we introduced Miss Hope Glidewell as our Coordinator of Family Faith Formation (CFFF), a position which is intended to carry on the ministries and activities formerly carried out by our "Director of Religious Education" (DRE). Hope is presently working towards a Master of Arts degree in Catechetics and Evangelization from the Franciscan University in Steubenville, all the while teaching 8th grade at St. Dominic School. You may also recognize her as our organist at the 6:30pm, and now, 8:00am Masses.

One of the ministries coordinated by Hope will be the Parish School of Religion (PSR). Last week our parish secretary sent an email to the known addresses of the prior year's students, asking for preferences regarding scheduling this year's PSR. We ask that if you received one of these emails, that you please respond! If you intend to enroll your children in PSR for the 2021-22 academic year and did not receive this email, please let the parish office know (217-222-5996) and we will include your preferences in our consideration for the coming year's schedule of activities.

When Hope calls to ask your assistance in our religious education offerings, please say a prayer and then say 'yes'! Evangelization is a task that belongs to us all, helping us to increase our faith, even as we learn to share it with others!
