A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

Welcome to those who join us this weekend to celebrate the Anointing of the Sick at Masses. Last week, I spent my article with a little teaching about the Anointing and how it is celebrated in public and at Mass. This week, I'd like to offer some thoughts and reminders about receiving the sacrament in emergencies and at the end-of-life.



The Anointing of the Sick is one of three sacraments that comprise the "Last Rights". A full celebration of the "Last Rights" includes a sacramental Confession, Viaticum (Holy Communion, "food for the journey"), and then the Anointing itself. When a person is near death and unable to confess or receive Holy Communion, the Anointing itself is sufficient to provide all the graces needed to transition from this world into the next. The fullness of the Church's consolation for the dying however, is found in celebrating all three sacraments of "Last Rights" when a person is conscious and able. Thus, it is important not to wait for the final moments before death, but to celebrate the three sacraments in a timely way,

perhaps days before death, when a seriously ill person starts to take a turn for the worse.

With respect to ministry in the hospital and nursing homes, the pandemic response since last spring has sometimes made access to the hospital for routine ministry difficult, and sometimes impossible. In recent months, access to these facilities has become easier, but this may tighten up again due to the recent resurgence in infections. Deacon and I are registered with the hospital's chaplaincy program, which provides us routine access to the hospital. That being said, if you desire the anointing and can plan it (for instance, in anticipation of a procedure or surgery), we ask you to consider requesting the sacrament *before* entering the hospital, just to guarantee access to the sacrament in routine cases. If you or a loved one is nearing death, please make the request for a priest as early as possible to insure that access is enabled. I (Fr. Tom) am trained and certified (and fully confident in the measures provided by the hospital) to go into COVID rooms and have done so on more than a few occasions during this pandemic to deliver the Last Rights to dying patients. Indeed, I know I have been exposed to COVID a number of times beyond even the time that I had the disease myself last November... but since being vaccinated, I have been frequently tested and not been aware of having or carrying the disease, which is a testament to the effectiveness of the vaccine and sufficient reason for me to have received it.

Rest assured, even if the notice to go to the hospital is late and urgent, we will respond 24/7 to those calls as best we can. The parish phone line has an "emergency line" which is for the specific purpose of requesting the emergency ministry of a priest (any other messages left, such as requests for emergency aid, on that line are thrown away with no action taken). Our phone system will respond when a call is left on that line and find me wherever I might be in the entire world. (I kid you not... I responded to a call when I was in Germany with the Air Force to a call left on the emergency line in my previous parish!) Now, I may not be able to personally come if I am out of town or something else is going on, but we will make every effort to dispatch a priest from one of the parishes to assist those in need.

Announcement: Sister Jo Ann Volk, SSND is going to be leaving us in September to return to the motherhouse in St. Louis. As a result, she will be vacating our house which she has been renting, the old rectory for St. Dominic Church, at 3800 Columbus. After consultation with the joint Parish Councils in June and the Finance Council in July, we have decided to sell this house. Before we engage the services of a Realtor, we are going to entertain discussions with interested parishioners and other parties leading towards potential offers on this property.



We anticipate discussion starting \$109,900, as-is (with right to inspection) which would be expected to be our listing price. The house has three bedrooms with approximately 1042 square feet of main floor space. It has a basement which is dry, but mostly unfinished.

Those who would like to make serious inquiries and would like to see the house should contact the parish office (222-5996) to make arrangements. DO NOT contact Sr. Jo Ann directly or go to the house invited... it is still her home! If we do not receive or choose to accept an offer by August 15, we will enlist the assistance of a Realtor to sell the house on the open market.
