

Back in June, the Patronal Feast of St. Anthony fell (June 15) on Sunday and received the dignity of a Sunday celebration at the parish. This week our other patron, St. Dominic also falls on Sunday (August 8), and with special permission from Bishop Paprocki, we are celebrating the feast of our second "spiritual father" on Sunday as well.

Dominic de Guzman was born in 1170 in the Castile region of Spain. Little is known of his father, but his mother, Blessed Joan of Aza, who was known by the distinction of her own virtues. Dominic had three siblings, the first, Anthony, became a diocesan priest, the next, Manez, became a Dominican Friar with Dominic. There was a sister who is mostly unknown, but who had two sons who became Dominican preachers. Influential in the lives of them all was an uncle. Don Gonzalo of Aza, who was the arch-

priest of Gumiel de Izan, a nearby town. Dominic went to live with him when he was 14 years old, becoming a cleric of the local cathedral and living in an Augustinian community as a young priest.

While on a mission with the Bishop of Osma around 1204, Dominic had a spiritual awakening when he spent all night conversing with a man who adhered to the popular heresy of Albigensianism. In summary, the Albigensian heresy saw the world as a battlefield for good and evil, where the human person was a soul trapped in a body, awaiting final release and liberation at the end of life. The earthly realm was considered evil and corrupt, the creation of Satan, while the spiritual realm was the creation of God. The more a man was corrupted by food, family, and posessions, the more he was trapped and inhibited from spiritual growth. Suicide was considered a praiseworthy act. The Incarnation and the Sacraments, because of their corporeal realities, were denied.

Dominic engaged in a preaching ministry in southern France for about 10 years, having no official status with the Church, but becoming a leader of a band of preachers. They were not contemplatives like monks, nor were they even necessarily priests or missionaries. Rather, Dominic and his companions were focused on assisting with the various pastoral ministries and local parish priests of the Church with preaching as a particular focus. Dominic went to the Fourth Lateran Council in 1214 to find approbation for his fledgling order, to which Pope Innocent III gave permission, despite a canon which was to prohibit the proliferation of many new orders and associations of faithful, which had become a problem in that time— but Innocent received a dream that the Lateran church was about to collapse, when Dominic came to the rescue and supported it on his own shoulders. In 1216, the new pope, Honorius III confirmed his order and its constitutions which outlined its way of life and its apostolic focus on preaching.

Soon, Dominic had a band of followers, and rather than establishing stable ministries in larger communities, Dominic had the intuition that he must "spread the seed, not hoard it," by sending the brothers out on mission in small groups. Wherever they travelled, the brothers prayed and preached for the conversion of sinners, and in unevangelized places to announce the Good News of Jesus Christ and everlasting life. By the general chapter of the order in 1221, there were some sixty friaries spread as far as Poland, Scandinavia, Palestine, and in Canturbury, London, and Oxford.




Dominicans are sometimes called "hounds of the Lord" based on the play on the Latin words, domini (the Lord's) and canes (dogs).

Dominic fell ill while visiting Cardinal Ugolino at Venice

who was a friend and supporter of the Dominicans. He retreated to a country location where he spoke his testament to his brothers, encouraging evangelical poverty, humility, and charity. Dominic died on August 6, 1221 at the age of fifty-two, and was canonized only 13 years later by Cardinal Ugolino, who was later Pope Gregory IX.
