It's time. As we all know, it is sometimes hard to hear in St. Anthony Church, and our sound system has been on its last legs for a long time. The Ladies Society provided funding to replace the wireless microphones for the priest and deacon a few years ago, which has helped in the interim, but one or two of the speakers hanging in the front of the church have been 'blown out' and simply do not work and have been 'acting up' recently. One of the remaining speakers, if it is turned 'up', broadcasts static and interference when it is at its full, proper operating volume.

Over the last several years, I have had a few suppliers come through and offer thoughts and bids on a new system. A couple of them seeing the scope of the job and seeing the demands of the worship space declined to even offer a bid. I do have a bid from a professional sound company out of Galesburg, who did the systems at Blessed Sacrament Church and the Church of St. Peter, as well as many other churches and public venues in the tri-state area. This is the company that I think needs to do this job. We can't afford to re-do the work in a few years if we find that the system doesn't totally meet our needs. We can't afford to leave this job and equipment to well-meaning, cut-rate amateurs who might not be around to service or expand the system in the years to come. The price tag for the work I am proposing is not cheap... \$20,000, but it includes a modern digital signal processor, power supplies, wiring, a rack setup in the sacristy, state-of-the-art auditorium-quality Bose speakers, and professional installation. I am also trying to engineer this system to accommodate enhancements in the years to come so that, for instance, if we need or want to web-cast or audio stream from the church again we can do so without too much additional cost or complication. I am told that the supply chains for equipment are a bit irregular at the moment, so a committed order today might not result in a completed project until after the first of the year or maybe as late as spring. I would like to get the process rolling in any case.

With the permission of our Finance Council and the Diocese of Springfield, along with your support, I'd like to proceed on doing this project. We do not really have a discretionary budget for capital improvements as we tend to respond to needs and emergencies, rather than planning for such projects. We are getting in a position to be able to be more deliberate about budgeting, but for this project, we are going to have to treat it as an 'extra'. If there are parishioners who can step forward with a little 'extra' support over their regular church support, this would really help us get this project done. Donations in a separate envelope marked 'sound system' placed in the collection would be appreciated as well as other direct assistance mailed or presented to the parish office. Thank you for your consideration of this request! I will keep you posted on the progress of this project.



This week, I spoke with Mr. Leonardo DeFilippis, the founder and president of St. Luke Productions. They are a performing arts company who travels the country with several live one-person productions on the lives of the saints... you may have seen "Vianney", "John of the Cross", or "St. Francis: Troubador of God's Peace" in person or on EWTY V Peace" in person or on EWTN. You may also have seen the full-length feature film PRODUCTIONS "Therese" where DeFilippis starred as Louis Martin, St. Therese's father. A few years ago, St. Luke Productions debuted their newest show "Tolton" with a visit at

Quincy University. (Most of these productions are available to be seen on video through our FORMED subscription!) The St. Luke team is preparing a tour of the Diocese of Springfield with their show "Maximillian" which stars DeFilippis as St. Maximillian Kolbe, the saint of Auschwitz. This is a wonderful show and we are going to host it here at St. Anthony's on Thursday, December **2 at 7 pm**. We will be needing volunteers to help host the show with setup and tear-down as well as hospitality for our guests. The intention is to make the show free to parishioners and the public, so we invite everyone to put this date on the calendar and spread the word. I'll have more information on precisely what volunteer opportunities are available soon.



Finally, I have been chatting with **Fr. Zach Edgar**, the still-relatively-new chaplain at the Illinois Veterans' Home, about the possibility of offering a mini-parish**mission** for Advent. We are looking at keeping the topic and the activities simple in light of the Advent season and in respect for the vagaries for planning and scheduling which still exist as we are exiting (hopefully!) the pandemic. We are looking at the second week of advent, in anticipation of the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Mary, to have a series of talks and spiritual exercises on "Mary, the Spouse of the Holy Spirit". Please watch out for future announcements and please plan to join us for these evenings as well.
