A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

This week, I have a few more announcements and news for the parish.



First, you may have noticed that the main doors leading from the vestibule into the church have been fitted with an automatic door opener. This system allows users to open the doors as they always have (manually) or by waving their hand in front of the receptacle to the left of the door when entering, or at the right when exiting. We'll be fine-tuning the system in the coming weeks, and as always, the intention is to provide a little extra help for those who

need it, rather than replacing the ministry of our greeters and others who welcome members and visitors of our church. The automatic door opening system is a gift in memory of Marge Benz, who died in April of 2021 and is also memorialized with her husband, Ab, in the sliding glass doors leading outside the church.

We also have received a gift in memory of Jim Holtman by his family. Jim passed in August of this year. This gift was designated to purchasing a set of matching *ciboria*, the 'bowls' with lids which are used to hold the Eucharistic hosts. The matching set stacks, and can easily be used both for the distribution of Holy Communion as well as reservation of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle. The present set of ciboria in use at St. Anthony Church will be cleaned up and placed in service at St. Dominic, where the vessels in use there are ready to be retired.



Thank you to so many who remember St. Anthony Church in the memorials of their loved ones who have died. These gifts, along with legacies which come from planned gifts and estates are most helpful in providing for those 'extras' which are totally out of reach due to our ongoing efforts to simply cover our normal operating expenses. We try our best to accommodate special gifts like these according to the needs in the parish and the ability of the gift to cover all of the expenses incurred. My hope is that as we get our operating expenses better under control, all of the memorial gifts which are otherwise designated to the parish, but without a specific project in mind, might be designated to our Foundation fund (our endowment fund with the diocese which now stands at about \$50,000 and provides an annual payment to the parish, which we have continued to 'roll over' over the years) or to Scholarships for Catholic Education, such as the Fr. Irenaeus Kimminau Scholarship for St. Dominic School which is administered by the Quincy Catholic Elementary Schools Foundation. With these long-term legacies and all the other work we need to do to continue to maintain our facilities as hospitable, welcoming, prayerful places, we encourage our parishioners to please consider remembering St. Anthony Church and St. Dominic School as part of their funeral plans and wills.

A final item for this week: Last year we invited our parishioners to consider making an offering to a fund which will be used to enhance the Christmas bonuses the parish gives to our hard-working lay staff, especially in light of these challenging years where the COVID pandemic has occupied so much time and attention in the workplace. Last year, you came through with about \$4,000 which was distributed among the lay staff in proportion to their full time/part time status, as well as their leadership roles within the parish. With about 25 staff members to remember... our teachers, our office staff, maintenance, and others... nobody is getting rich, but it was a gesture on part of our people which was deeply appreciated by those who serve the parish day-in and day-out. I am aware that there are parishioners who have



suffered severe economic impacts from the fallout of the COVID disaster, and if this is the case, please do not over-extend yourselves this holiday season. But for those who have the ability to express their thanks to our parish staff, we are providing envelopes to make that appreciation known. In addition to any monetary contributions you might want to offer, if you have a particular note of thanks to a particular staff member (or group such as the 'office staff' or 'the teachers'), you can include that in the envelope as well and we will pass it along. We need to finish this collection just before Thanksgiving in order to pass out envelopes at a staff dinner taking place on December 2. Thank you for your consideration!

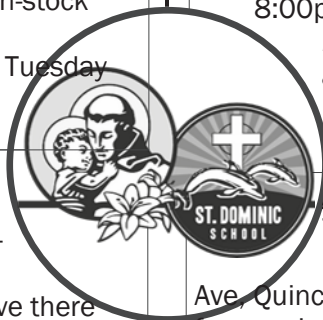
