## A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



A widow placed a few coins in the temple treasury, which Jesus pointed out to his disciples: Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all that she had, her whole livelihood. (Mark 12: 43-44)

The widow of today's Gospel is not lauded by the percentage of her gift, or by what little was left behind for her own use, but instead for the spirit of her generosity. Could such a modest gift ever be of any real help to the temple or its treasury? Probably not. Indeed, one might judge the humble gift as a waste or even a crime against the faith of the old woman. But generosity is a virtue that counteracts selfishness and indifference toward one's neighbor. Generosity transforms the giver. And so, the widow gave not from things external to her, but from the very bread she might have otherwise eaten. This is the spirit which the Gospel of Mark has been encouraging in those who hear the saving words of Jesus... not to be full on the things of this world, but totally reliant on the grace and providence of our Lord.

### 5th Grade Leaders - Our Lady of Fatima

During the month of November, our 5th grade class, along with their teacher Mrs. Joann Ellerman, will be sharing the story of the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima. The story takes place in the village of Fatima, Portugal. Three children were tending a flock of sheep. The children saw an angel. He was transparent and shining like a crystal. He said, "Do not be afraid. I am the angel of peace. Pray with me." During the rest of 1916, as World War I raged in Europe, this angel showed himself two more times to the children but they told no one what they had seen. In the spring of 1917 on May 13th near that same tiny village, the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, appeared to those same three young peasant children, Francisco, Jacinta, and Lucia. She appeared as "a lady dressed in white, shining brighter than the sun, giving out rays of clear and intense light." She promised to come to the children on the 13th of each month. Knowing that Mary wants us to pray the Rosary we would like to invite everyone in our school family to say the Rosary as much as we can. The 5th graders have created a link Rosary on the wall in the computer room hallway to keep a running total. Please call the school office and report the number of Rosaries you pray with your family. By praying the Rosary, we experience peace knowing God is in control.

Let's see how big we can get our Rosary total. Turn in the number of Rosaries that you and your family have prayed every week. I will then put the running total on the wall by our Rosary.
