December 5, 2021 — Second Sunday of Advent (C)

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Each year on the **Second Sunday of Advent**, we hear about **John the Baptist**. While we are often caught up with the strangeness of John as a person, the important thing to hear is his message and respond. John offers a baptism for the forgiveness of sins and calls us to repentance in anticipation of the coming of the Lord.


John was the last in the line of Old Testament prophets; he was the miracle-son of the temple priest Zechariah, as we hear in the first chapter of the Gospel of Luke. The priestly class was entrusted with the job of begging recon-

ciliation of God for humanity by the way of animal sacrifices. But rather than being associated with priestly class of the temple and the worship taking place there, as would be expected of the son of a priest (especially one whose birth was such a special grace from God to elderly parents), John turned his back on the temple and was found out in the wilderness, promoting a new ritual to be performed outside the temple precincts: baptism. Christians reading these scriptures won't find this so unusual, as baptism is recognized as a sacrament, but the Jewish people would find this novel and strange, perhaps even offensive!

As I said last weekend, Advent gives us the opportunity to look to the past (the coming of Christ in history), the present (the coming of Christ in mystery), and the future (the coming of Christ in glory). In recognizing these arrivals ('advents') of our God, we find ourselves invited to worship his Body... in the memory of the infant, in the mystery of his sacramental Real Presence, in his coming in glory. John the Baptist, in anticipating Christian Baptism, is preparing the world to receive the Mystical Body of Christ... the Christ we worship on the altar along with the Mystical Body which is identified with the Church of our own age. What is the defining mark of those who have been baptized? Those who have been baptized participate in the life of the Holy Trinity through sanctifying grace—the grace of justification which incorporates one into Christ and his Church. Therefore, to know Christ requires us to know something of the Church. Thankfully, the Church is more than a social or governance structure for Christ and his people. The Church is the living body of Christ, proclaiming Glad Tidings, release to captives, healing for the sick, and forgiveness for the sinner. In proclaiming a baptism of repentance, John anticipates the ministry of the Church as well as the person of Christ.




