

## A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:





### A Message from Mrs. Carol Frericks—Principal

#### Second Grade Leaders Teach Us About Our Lady of Guadalupe

During the month of December our second grade class along with their teacher, Mrs. Hoffer, lead our daily Morning Meetings and teach our school about the Holy Moments that happened with Our Lady of Guadalupe. We have learned that Guadalupe is located in Mexico where Mary appeared to a man named Juan Diego. On December 9, 1531, Mary appeared to Juan Diego while he was on his way to Mass. She asked him to approach the bishop and request that a shrine be built to her there, where she would bless those who called upon her. However, the bishop demanded that Juan Diego provide proof of the vision. Mary appeared three times, miracles happened, and a shrine was finally built there. Millions of natives converted to become Catholic at the news of what happened. Millions more made pilgrimages over the next five centuries to see the miraculous shrine, and to honor Our Lady of Guadalupe. Great miracles and Holy Moments continue to occur there, even today.
