A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Progress on the parking lot project: As I mentioned late last year, we received a gift from the estate from Kent Wellman which will allow us to rebuild the parking lot just south of the church and in front of the parish hall. Kent left, in his own hand, notes that said that he wanted the job “done right” and so, I’ve had a conference with engineers at Poepping, Stone, Bach & Associates (PSB&A) to make sure we have the project specified as completely as possible so we can move towards taking bids and starting

the project as soon as possible this spring. (We want this project done in advance of the St. Anthony Picnic in July!) There is a lot to think about and a lot of possibilities. The lot will be concrete, like the lot to the west of the church. We need to make sure to have proper lighting, drainage and curbs. I am asking the engineers to look at doing a little bit of tuckpointing on the brickwork on the front of the Parish Hall and to bring the concrete all the way up to the door so that there is a ‘no-steps’ entry into the parish office. I am looking forward to seeing designs and specifications soon and to share them with the Men’s Society and the Pastoral and Finance Councils. When the specifications and plans are set, we will publish a notice seeking bids to do the job.

Also as a directive of the Wellman estate, we are looking at replacing the basement cooler at the parish hall as well. I am looking at not only that, but ideas for modernizing the entire kitchen. This probably would not be included in the immediate project before us, but hopefully could be something to look at doing soon. I would love to see some accessible, modern bathrooms down there, along with (as is the case with modern commercial kitchens) a flow-plan that allows for food storage and prep, cooking, serving, dishwashing and storage. I’ll keep you informed on the progress of these projects. —

As for the speaker system, I heard from our contractors for that project and they are still indefinite on the timeline for not only receiving equipment but scheduling their crew to install the system. Again, my hope is to have this project completed as soon as we can, hopefully before Easter. Thanks to all who have so generously contributed to this important project!



Finally, I usually run this message around the Christmas season, but I seemed to have missed it this year: If you or someone you love has received a proposal of marriage in recent months and the plan is to be married at St. Anthony’s, I ask that they call the parish office as soon as possible to begin the marriage preparation process. The Diocese of Springfield requires at least six months’ preparation before the celebration of marriage. Preparation includes a short investigation to make sure that both parties are “free to marry” in the Church, and then a “Pre-Cana” marriage-skills course, either held over a weekend or taught by one of our local couples. While the Church earnestly recommends that couples do not cohabit before marriage and that they live lives consistent with the

chastity expected of unmarried persons, we do work with those couples who are trying to live up to the marriage laws of the Church. Couples who have a permanent domicile (living place) outside the parish should contact their parish priest where they live (which means they should normally be registered, practicing parishioners of the parish where they live) in order to start this process. Those with prior marriages (either party, Catholic or non-Catholic alike) should allow for extra time to make sure that their prior unions are resolved and that both parties are, indeed, “free to marry in the Church.”

The Church reveres the beauty and power of sacramental marriage, and rejoices with those who hope to make their marriages expressions of faith in God’s eternal love!

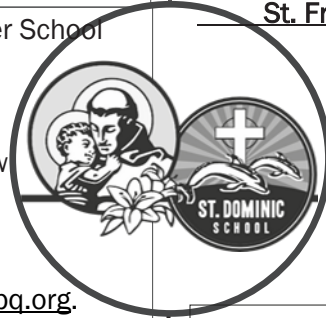
