Lenten Regulations: Lent begins this year on **Ash Wednesday, March 2, 2022** and will end just prior to the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, **April 14, 2022**, when the Paschal Triduum begins. Lent is the principal penitential season in the Church year, anticipating the spiritual renewal of **Easter** and of the entire **Easter Season**. All Christian Faithful are urged to develop and maintain a program of self-denial, prayer, and the performance of deeds of charity and mercy (including giving of alms), *in addition* to the following *minimal* Lenten disciplines:

• **ABSTINENCE – Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.**

• *While abstinence is not required under the age of 14, it is laudable that parents teach children abstinence and other suitable acts penance as a way to learn and understand the true spirit of the Lenten season.*

• **FAST – Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.** On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.

• *Over age 59, it is laudable to follow the discipline of fasting on these days, but one should not scruple about modifying or breaking the fast at this age when matters of health and well-being come into question.*

• *Under age 59, when pregnant or nursing, performing significant manual labor, or suffering from a serious illness (a chronic illness such as diabetes, hypoglycemia, or a more immediate illness where fasting might not be healthy) it may be morally impossible to follow this precept. Those who break the fast under these circumstances do so with no fault or sin.*

• To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful. (...meaning, under normal circumstances of will and knowledge, 'mortal sin'.)

• If in doubt about one's health or ability to follow these regulations, the pastor has the ability to dispense or commute the obligation in *individual* cases for the good of the faithful.

• School lunches, funeral luncheons, fish fries, and other activities on parish grounds are expected to follow the abstinence precepts.

• Priests of the deanery will be gathered at St. Anthony on Sunday, March 20 and at St. Peter's on Sunday April 10 to provide additional opportunities for confessions on the afternoon of Sunday, March 20 and at St. Peter's on Sunday, April 10, both at 2pm.

• Friday, March 25 is the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord, celebrating the event (9 months before Christmas) when the Angel Gabriel visited Mary, and she conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit. This is a day of celebration when Lenten penances and practices should be laid aside to observe and celebrate the mystery of the Incarnation of our Lord.

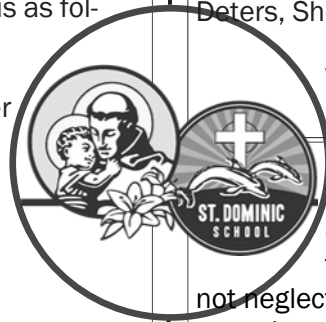
