A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Every second Sunday in Lent, we hear a Gospel account of the Transfiguration of the Lord. In this event, Jesus revealed his glorified body to Peter, James, and John. The disciples' response seems rather puzzling, though: "Let us build three tents (or 'huts'): one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." It seems disciples were seeking a moment to rest in this amazing encounter and have a place—a destination—where they and others could come to see the Lord and these revered prophets. In a way, this was a first step in 'capturing' the religious experience to a specific place or a specific time so that they could come back and draw strength from it later. In a way, the disciples were asking Jesus if they could build the first Christian church on that mountaintop site. But rather than church-building or other institutions of the worldly Church, the Transfiguration reminds us of the absolute centrality of Jesus Christ—the Risen Lord whom we encounter in the Eucharist—as the center and the summit of our faith!

A Message from Bishop Paprocki:

As part of our diocese's response to Pope Francis' call to provide input for the Synod of Bishops that will take place at the Vatican in October of 2023, I invite all the faithful of our diocese to a diocesan-wide listening session on Sunday, March 27 at 2 p.m. Groups will gather locally in the deaneries and connect together with me and across the deaneries by video. Seven locations have been designated [and ours here in Quincy is:]



Quincy Deanery: St. Francis Solanus Parish, Quincy

The theme for the "Synod on Synodality" is: A Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission. Pope Francis has encouraged bishops around the world to engage a process of "synodality," characterized by dialogue, accompaniment, and collaboration among the diocesan leadership, ordained clergy, religious, and lay faithful. In our diocese, we have fully embraced this approach, having completed our Fourth Diocesan Synod of 2017, which involved a comprehensive process of dialogue and discussion, and produced great insights and goals for our diocese to become a community of missionary disciples.

While our official synod process has been completed, we continue to sustain dialogue, listening, and collaboration through avenues such as our Diocesan Pastoral Council, Diocesan Presbyteral Council, parish pastoral visits, and Canonical visitations. After a pause due to COVID-related restrictions, I recently revived parish pastoral visits and intend to visit all 129 parishes over the next few years.

These important and ongoing means of sustained dialogue and collaboration will be supplemented by the input from the local gatherings of the faithful in the deaneries throughout our diocese on March 27. In this session, which will begin in each location at 2 p.m., we will discuss three topics:

- We will reflect on the progress we have made in the five years that have passed since we held our Fourth Diocesan Synod in 2017
- We will reflect on synodality and evangelization
- We will also reflect on challenges to authentic discipleship.

I look forward to the ongoing dialog across our diocese and the insights we will share in this upcoming listening session.

The 7th-grade class is also helping us learn how to be a faithful Disciple and sharing God's faithfulness with others.

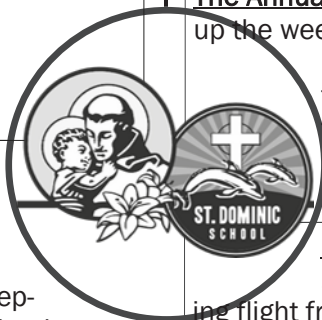
