Announcement! For the last two years, the Quincy Catholic Elementary Schools Leadership Team, under the guidance and authority of the four Quincy pastors, has been working with Quincy Notre Dame High School, Quincy University, the Diocese of Springfield, and a consulting group from Boston, "Partners in Mission", using a grant from the Tracy Family Foundation, to plan for the future of Catholic Schools in the Quincy area.
