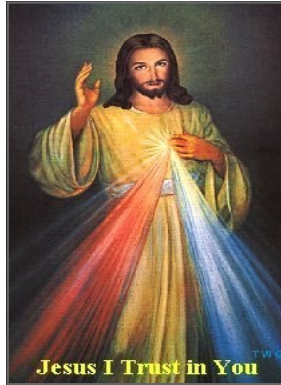

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

Since 2001, the Second Sunday, or 'octave' day, of Easter has been observed as "Divine Mercy Sunday". On this day, we reflect on the glory of God's mercy in the full light of the resurrection. God's mercy is not something we earn by way of our confessions or our Lenten disciplines or anything else taking place in us, but rather it comes when we are least deserving, least able to help ourselves, when we are otherwise lost to the darkness of our fallen nature. Divine Mercy is simply there for our asking, which demands a spiritual posture of extraordinary faith and trust in our Risen Lord— again, Mercy is neither earned nor owed to us for our works, but rather comes to us in complete humility, sincere contrition, and complete trust in the Risen Christ. From our experience of God's Mercy, we are

called to share mercy with others.

The Divine Mercy visionary was St. Faustina Kowalska (1905-1938), who was a simple, uneducated, Polish nun, living at about the same time and not that far from the home of a young Karol Wojtya, who would later be St. Pope John Paul II. Sr. Faustina, at the command of her spiritual director, Fr. Michał Sopoćko (1988-1975, who himself is being examined as a potential candidate for sainthood) wrote over 600 pages in her spiritual diary, recounting her journey in prayer and the responses that she received, teaching her and the world about the glory of Divine Mercy. Embedded in these writings are the devotional tools that many recognize: the Divine Mercy Chaplet, the image of Christ with streams of light pouring out of his Sacred Heart, the call to devote the Second Sunday of Easter as a uniquely-privileged day for sacramental Confession and other devout works of faith and mercy. The diary itself, widely available in English translation, is a rewarding read in and of itself, and is presently under consideration in a petition to name Faustina a "doctor of the Church".

Here are some details about the trip I am co-sponsoring with Fr. Tom Meyer of Blessed Sacrament Church. About 35 seats out of 55 have been filled for our trip to the Holy Land August 24-September 2. Thursday, August 25, 2022 (Bethlehem)

We will Visit the Church of Nativity built in the year 333, we'll see the Silver Star that marks the spot where baby Jesus was born. Then Visit Shepherd's field, Mass worship at the Shepherds' field over 2000-year-old Grotto where the news from the angels were received. We'll have Traditional biblical lunch at a local Bedouin style restaurant. Great Chance to try popular local beer and smoke popular local Hookah. Then we'll visit Carmelite Monastery where Blessed Mariam of the Crucified Jesus is buried, here we'll pray the rosary. We'll also visit one of the best scenic views in Bethlehem, Cremisan valley, Monastery and winery, here we will taste wine, learn about the active monastery and nunnery within the valley, learn about the christian farmers who will lose their ancestry's land behind the segregation wall, learn how the pope tried to help them. Dinner and overnight at Bethlehem Manger Square Hotel.

Friday, August 26, 2022 (Bethlehem)

We will start our morning with a mass at the Nativity church where Jesus was born. Then we will start our geo-political tour of Bethlehem to properly understand the situation of the Christian population and their hardships. This includes Rachel Tomb area, Checkpoint, Apartheid Wall and refugee camp. We will have a traditional Palestinian lunch in the old city of Bethlehem. We will visit the milk grotto where Mary fed baby Jesus, this is where we will be praying the rosary. We will then stop next-door at a local olivewood factory to see how they hand carve into native olive trees to make the beautiful artwork that you sometimes buy at your church. The rest of the day will be free time to adjust for Jet Lag, rest, walk around the old city of Bethlehem to explore the day to day culture or do anything you'd like. Later that day we will have dinner and overnight at the Manger Square Hotel.
