Martha & Mary: Last week we heard the Gospel of the "Good Samaritan", in which we heard that mercy and Christian charity looks like something... it is an active involvement with the needs and concerns of others over one's self. Anointing of the Sick: On the weekend of August 6 & 7, we will offer the Anointing of the Sick at all of the weekend Masses. Those who have a serious illness, an upcoming surgery, or are 'weighted down by the burden of years' are encouraged to sit in the front row that weekend to receive the sacrament along with the prayers of our parish community. If you have a family member or friend who is unable to attend Mass on a regular basis, we encourage you to make a special effort to help that person come to Mass that weekend and receive the Anointing.

The sacrament is, of course, offered at other times by calling the parish office or, if you are in Blessing Hospital or another health facility, by letting

your nurse or chaplain know. We encourage all who anticipate needing the sacrament to ask for it in advance, in a timely way if at all possible, to minimize emergency calls and, at times, to help arrange proper permissions to access health facilities which are still on "COVID lockdowns".

Mass is offered each week by St. Anthony parish at Good Samaritan home at 10 am on Thursdays. We are always in need of volunteers who can come to Mass and help transport the residents to the chapel and back. Please contact the parish office (222-5996) for more information about this opportunity to help our nursing home residents celebrate the sacraments! An Anointing Mass for all residents will be held at Good Samaritan Home at 10 am on Thursday, August 3.
