## A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Next week we will celebrate the Anointing of the Sick at all of the weekend Masses. We try to have a public celebration of the sacrament every year for those who would like to invite the prayer of the entire parish community over them. The Anointing of the Sick is the most recognized part of the three sacraments that have long been called "Last Rites". A full celebration of the "Last Rites" includes a Sacramental Confession, Holy Communion (sometimes called *Viaticum*, meaning "to go along with you"), and the Anointing. In the years since the Second Vatican Council, the Church has called for a renewal and wider celebration of the sacrament, even as we are doing at Sunday Mass.

The Church broadly encourages those who are suffering from serious illnesses to approach the Divine Physician through the Anointing of the Sick, trusting in his plan to conform the suffering of this world to the saving cross. I have often reflected on how those who receive the Anointing of the Sick are, in a way, 'ordained' to the priesthood of the suffering Christ. Those who are Anointed are called to offer their sufferings, as Paul reflects, "...in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ, on behalf of his body which is the Church..." While the passion and death of the Lord is perfect and sufficient for the salvation of the world, Jesus invites the members of his body to share their sufferings with his. In doing so, human suffering is transformed. Suffering becomes not simply a defacement of human happiness and dignity, but a pathway to the glory of the resurrection.

And so, who may receive the Anointing of the Sick at Mass?

- Anyone who is suffering from a chronic disease or disorder which significantly impacts daily life. The condition need not be imminently life-threatening, but should be of a serious nature.
- Anyone who is suffering from what the Church calls a 'psychic disorder'... this could mean any number of psychological ailments--depression, anxiety, addictions, and others. How do you determine if it is 'serious enough'? Usually I advise that if you are seeing a physician or counsellor or taking prescription medication to fight the condition, you could/should consider the sacrament.
- Finally, anyone who considers themselves oppressed by the weight of their age/years. I will leave that to the discretion of each individual how old that means!

A couple of ground rules: 1) It is not anyone else's place to ask or discuss with others what disease or disorder those receiving the sacrament might be dealing with. This is a community celebration of healing, not of discussing others' illnesses. 2) The time when we offer the sacrament at Mass is a time of prayer for the whole community, not just the ones receiving the sacrament. If you are not receiving the sacrament, please pray for all who are in need of God's healing.

It remains advisable for those not feeling well to stay home. COVID in and of itself is probably not a sufficient reason to receive the sacrament, but if it becomes a serious case (especially if it lands you in the hospital,) please call and arrangements can be made to administer the sacrament there.

Those who are receiving the sacrament should sit in the front rows of the church. Please consider taking the extra time to bring family, friends, and neighbors who are usually unable to come to church, that they may join us for this special celebration.

In addition to all those who are receiving the sacrament at Mass on Sunday, we also call to mind the many parishioners and friends who are in the nursing homes of our community. We now serve Good Samaritan Home with Mass on Thursday at 10am. These residents will be anointed in their own celebration of Mass on Thursday, August 4. We hold them in prayer and all who serve the sick... physicians and nurses, technicians and housekeepers, health administrators and clerks and chaplains... all in the healthcare field who share in the work of spreading God's healing mercies.
