A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

Welcome to Fr. Jaybalan ("Jay") Raju from the Diocese of Sivagangai, India. Father will speak about the foreign missions going on in the name of the Church to the peoples of southern India. We have a missionary cooperative weekend each year in order to recall that our Church has a universal outreach across nations and cultures, and to allow us who have been greatly blessed to provide for the spiritual and material welfare of those in need. Presently, Father Jay resides at the Epiphany Cathedral in Venice, Florida, where he serves as a missionary to us in the United States, providing for the pastoral care of as a parish priest in the Diocese of Venice. I invite your generous response to his appeal this weekend, and invite and encourage you to hold the people of India, adopted home of St. Thomas the Apostle, who first evangelized the nation, in your prayers.



This week, I will be leaving with about fifty travellers and Fr. Tom Meyer from Blessed Sacrament Church on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. I leave right after Wednesday morning Mass at St. Dominic's on August 24 and will return on Sunday, September 4. In my absence, we will not have daily Mass at St. Anthony Church. But hopefully during

that time we will be able to get the carpets cleaned in the church during the week of the 27th and to get the parking lot project started sometime during the next two weeks as well.

The parish office staff will be able to receive and direct calls for priestly assistance during my absence. I thank Fr. Don Blickhan and Fr. Joe Zimmerman who will be helping out with weekend Masses, Fr. Steve Arisman who will have Mass at Good Samaritan Home on Thursdays, and the priests of St. Peter's who will be available to back me (and Fr. Meyer) for hospital ministry during this time.

As we depart, I am aware that there has been recent unrest in this region of the world—a land shared by Christians, Jews, and Muslims. so I ask your prayers for safety and peace for me and for our entire group. Know of my prayers for you during this time, which I shall offer at the various sites which stand in testimony to the very historical, human, and real presence of Christ who walked among us to show us the way to the Father.

School resumed this last week, with students from all of our Catholic Schools and QND getting back to work in their new classrooms. The buzz in the halls is the fulfilment of months of work and preparation on part of our school staffs and teachers, and I wish to acknowledge the outstanding efforts on part of Mrs. Frericks and each one of our teachers to get everything ready to go once again.



Each week our bulletin is published and sent home to our school families, in hopes that more of our families will read the bulletin and know the desire our parish has that they respond to the invitation to be ever-more active in the life and community of our parish. Catholic Education is rooted, first, in the identity we have as a people who gather to worship each Sunday and even daily, drawing near to the Lord in the Holy Eucharist. Indeed the coming years have been designated by our Bishop's Conference as a time of "Eucharistic Revival". The Second Vatican Council amplified centuries of teaching which identifies the Eucharist as the very "source and summit of the entire Christian Life". Indeed, our educational outreach, the stewardship we practice, the family life we promote... everything we do... is rooted in the mystery of God-with-Us under the appearances of common bread and wine which is truly the very Body and Blood of Christ. I invite our parents and students, all of our families, to find small, but practical ways to grow in faith and love for this Most Holy Sacrament, that as we all grow in love of the God who first loved us, that we might be successful in teaching and leading our children and their families and our whole parish in the ways of holiness.

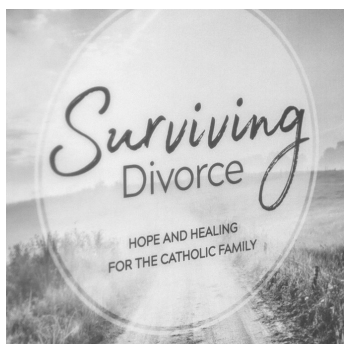
Begins September 4th!

Safe Environment Information

In order for us to be more aware of our surroundings and to watch out for others as well as protect ourselves the Diocese of Springfield requires all employees and volunteers to complete a safe environment program (1 time only) and a background check (every 5 years).

The Diocese of Springfield will now be using CMG Connect for safe environment training and background checks. The Protecting God's Children (PGC) will not be used in the future and a new program "Empowering God's Children" will be used instead. (Those who have completed PGC will be grandfathered in and not need to complete this new program which is available on line only.)

The background checks will now be completed online only, except for one form you will need to complete and return to the Safe Environment Office at the Diocese. Background checks need to be renewed every 5 years.

If you do not have access to a computer, you may contact us in the parish office and we will be glad to help you by using one of our computers. As a reminder, the Diocese of Springfield requires all volunteers to have completed either Protecting God's Children or Empowering God's Children and a background check. Each year the Diocese audits the parish list of volunteers and we would like to be in good standing.

Families of Faith begins with the first parent session on Sunday, September 4th, 9:00 a.m.-noon and the Community meeting will be September 25th with a picnic at 11:30 a.m.
